One of the first signs of spring is the beautiful prairie crocus. (we all anxiously await seeing these crocus')

Growing in locations with plenty of sun (like open prairie, roadsides and hillsides), prairie crocuses often bloom before the snow is gone, adding some colour to the landscape. It's saucer shaped blooms create a nice cozy place for insects to warm up helping them survive the early spring.

By blooming so early, the crocus guarantees itself the attention of available pollinators, like small bees and other insects. The crocus attracts them with the abundance of pollen in their bright yellow centres.



SASKATCHEWAN CONTINUES STRONG WHOLESALE TRADE GROWTH



Saskatchewan's wholesale trade growth continues, with the value increasing 30.3 per cent in February 2023 compared to February 2022, according to Statistics Canada. This was the second highest percentage change among the provinces.

"These numbers are further proof the hard work of our province's producers and manufacturers is paying off and Saskatchewan's economy is strong," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "This growth may be measured in dollars, but it really represents more jobs and opportunities for the people of this province."

NEW SASKATOON URBAN CAMP OPENING, UPDATE ON REMAND CENTRE

New Saskatoon Urban Camp can house 50 low-security offenders | CTV News

The new Urban Camp at the Saskatoon Correctional Centre is officially open and operational. Reduced custody inmates began moving from the old Urban Camp facility to the new one earlier today.

The new Urban Camp cost approximately \$8.59 million to develop and construct, and was originally announced as part of the Building a Strong Saskatchewan stimulus package. The facility is a full replacement of the previous structure and provides 50 reduced custody beds. The approximately 13,000 sq. ft. building also has a recreational space and two dedicated programming rooms designed to accommodate specific programming needs, such as smudging.

"This modern facility will further enable the Urban Camp program to deliver valuable programming and services to reduced custody offenders transitioning back into the community," Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Christine Tell said.

Capital city


The city of Regina is the 2nd largest in Saskatchewan. It was named after Queen Victoria although that is quite hard to tell ("Regina" translates to "queen" in Latin). Regina is home to Canada's oldest symphony orchestra and also Canada's only Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) training academy.

Located 260 km north of Regina is the province's largest city, Saskatoon. It has been the cultural and economic hub of central Saskatchewan ever since it was founded in 1882. The city's nickname is "Paris of the Prairies" because it has 9 river-crossing bridges.

EXPANDING ADDICTIONS TREATMENT ACROSS SASKATCHEWAN



36 new virtual outpatient treatment spaces will be coming online this spring as part of our government's commitment to increase addictions treatment capacity across Saskatchewan.

Providing a more flexible treatment option for individuals who have work, school and family responsibilities, these additional spaces will deliver greater access to support and meet people directly where they are at in their journey to recovery.

The 36 new spaces compliment the 14 post-treatment spaces announced in March and the 475 existing pre-treatment, detoxification, treatment and post-treatment beds across our province.

COYOTE SIGHTINGS IN SASKATOON



The City is advising the public that coyote sightings have occurred at various locations throughout Saskatoon. The City reminds people to keep their distance from coyotes and all wildlife as they can be unpredictable when confronted.

If you have any questions or concerns regarding coyotes or other wildlife within City limits, please contact Urban Biological Services at 306-975-3300. If an emergency occurs, please contact Saskatoon Police Service at 306-975-8300.

The following is what to do if you have a close encounter with a coyote:

Never approach the animal;

Look for a way out;

Be observant of the coyote's movements;

Act assertive, yell, and wave your arms so that the coyote maintains a healthy respect for humans; Ensure the animal has an escape route with enough space to flee the situation; and Keep pets on a leash and under control.

Coyotes are an important component of a balanced ecosystem and are common in all major municipalities across Canada. Rapid expansion of the city and design of larger green spaces has resulted in more wildlife sightings. Coyotes can be seen in residential and commercial areas, especially if

food and shelter are readily available.

Listed below are tips to help avoid a coyote encounter in your yard:

Never feed coyotes or leave food waste in accessible areas;

Seal off access to decks and other sheltered spaces in your yard;

Do not feed pets outdoors; and

Close the gate to your yard and ensure fencing is in good condition.


