

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



The Saskatchewan Urban Municipalities Association (SUMA) held its annual convention on April 16-19. Premier Scott Moe, Government of Saskatchewan Cabinet Ministers, along with several Government Members of the Legislative Assembly, attended the convention to discuss the 2023-24 Provincial Budget and connect with municipal leaders. Our government greatly values the partnership with SUMA and the province's urban communities.

Saskatchewan is growing at a rate we haven't seen in over 100 years. In 2022, the population increased by more than 29,000people. This growth is supported by our strong economy, which has created over 20,000 new jobs in 2022.

Our strong economy is fueled by strong commodity prices and increased private-sector investment. This allows our government to invest in programs and services that make Saskatchewan the best place to live, work and raise a family.

This year's budget provides \$503 million in direct support for Saskatchewan's growing municipalities, an increase of 12.1 per cent from last year. This includes Municipal Revenue Sharing, which will reach a

record \$297.9 million this year, up 13.4 per cent from last year's budget. Municipal Revenue Sharing provides predictable, no-strings-attached funding to use as local leaders see fit as they grow and build strong communities.

A total of \$152.7 million will be invested in municipal infrastructure in this year's budget. This includes the Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program (ICIP), which provides grants for community-based projects. It also consists of the New Building Canada Fund. These grants allow communities to invest in projects that will strengthen and grow Saskatchewan communities for years to come.

Communities across the province will benefit from 21 new infrastructure projects through a joint provincial and federal investment of \$42.1 million. The City of Lloydminster will benefit from a new arena and the Town of Balgonie will see a new aquatic centre, which will provide new opportunities for recreation and gathering places. In addition, several rural municipalities will see bridge replacements which will support the transportation systems of these communities. First Nations and Métis communities across the province will receive targeted funding totaling \$249.1 million. A record \$92.4 million investment will support Indigenous-led social and economic initiatives. The First Nations and Métis Consultation Participation Fund, which supports communities to engage in consultations related to the duty to consult, will receive continued investment. An additional continued investment of \$800,000 will support community-led Indigenous initiatives to address issues raised in *Reclaiming Power and Place: The Final Report of the National Inquiry into Missing and Murdered Indigenous Women and Girls*.

Additional investments will target Indigenous career training, post-secondary institutions, and initiatives to ensure students have the learning opportunities they need for bright futures. Enhanced support for on-reserve policing will help keep First Nations and Métis communities safe, and funding for the Métis Addictions Council of Saskatchewan Inc. and the Community Justice Alternative Measures Program will also provide valuable community-based supports. Investments in our strong and growing First Nations and Métis communities are investments in a strong Saskatchewan.

PROVINCE EXPANDS POLICE AND CRISIS TEAM IN REGINA AND SASKATOON



The Government of Saskatchewan is providing \$468,800 in the 2023-24 Budget to the Saskatoon Police Service and Regina Police Service to expand the Police and Crisis Team (PACT) program in the communities.

"Our province continues to look for innovative ways to better support individuals experiencing a mental health crisis," Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Christine Tell said. "The PACT program expansion will ensure that more clients are connected to the community supports they need, creating better outcomes for them and reducing emergency health care and police service requests."


SASKATCHEWAN NATIONAL DAY OF MOURNING APRIL 28



Each year, on April 28 is **Saskatchewan** National Day of Mourning. Canada recognizes the National Day of Mourning as a day for employers and employees to remember those who have died, and those injured or stricken by illness on the job.

On this day, Saskatchewan renews its commitment to improve occupational health and safety in the workplace. The Saskatchewan Legislature will read the names of those who lost their lives to their work into the provincial record. The Canadian Labour Congress inscribes the names in the National Registry in Ottawa.



SASKATCHEWAN'S EXPORTS TO ASEAN MARKET HIT RECORD \$2.9 BILLION




Saskatchewan's international engagement drives outcomes with merchandise exports to the Association of Southeast Asian Nations (ASEAN) increasing by 91.3 per cent in 2022.

Saskatchewan is Canada's leading exporter to the ASEAN region. In 2022, our exports were more than \$2.9 billion - up from \$1.5 billion in 2021 and greater than any other Canadian province. The top products were potash (\$2.4 billion), wheat (\$431.2 million), and semi-chemical wood pulp (\$44.7 million).

"The quality and sustainability of Saskatchewan commodities and products are key advantages being highlighted in the ASEAN market," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Continued engagement with ASEAN markets is critical to export growth, growing our population and ensuring quality of life for the people of Saskatchewan."

BE MINDFUL OF HANTAVIRUS WHILE CLEANING THIS SPRING



Saskatchewan residents are being reminded to take precautions against hantavirus as they start spring cleanup of enclosed buildings or vehicles.

Hantavirus infection is caused by breathing in contaminated airborne particles from the droppings, urine and saliva of infected deer mice. It can cause a rare, but potentially fatal lung disease known as hantavirus pulmonary syndrome.

"Exposure most often occurs when cleaning up sheds, barns, garages, cabins, or vehicles after winter," Saskatchewan's Deputy Chief Medical Health Officer Dr. Julie Kryzanowski said. "Particles can become airborne after sweeping, but it's also possible to get the virus by touching something that has been contaminated, and then touching your nose, mouth or eyes."

CENTENNIAL OF THE ROYAL CANADIAN NAVY RESERVE



The Government of Saskatchewan is celebrating and proclaiming 2023 as the Centennial of the Royal Canadian Navy Reserve. Established in 1923, the Naval Reserve has played an important role to Canada's safety, security and overall recruitment efforts for the Royal Canadian Navy for one hundred years.

The Naval Reserve has 24 divisions across Canada, with two in Saskatchewan: His Majesty's Canadian Ship (HMCS) *Unicorn* based in Saskatoon and HMCS *Queen* based in Regina. *Unicorn* was founded on April 27, 1923, with *Queen* established two months later, June 26.

"Our Saskatchewan units were essential in helping recruit navy reservists to defend Canada's freedom at home and abroad over the past century," Saskatchewan's Military Liaison and Moose Jaw Wakamow MLA Greg Lawrence said. "Saskatchewan is proud to acknowledge and recognize the service and sacrifice of all our naval reservists over the past one hundred years as we mark this milestone."

Provincial bird

The sharp-tailed grouse was selected as the provincial bird emblem in 1945. It is Saskatchewan's most popular game bird.



Provincial animal

The white-tailed deer was designated as the official animal of Saskatchewan in 2001 (although it first appeared on Saskatchewan's coat of arms in 1986).



Provincial flower

The western red lily was made the official flower of Saskatchewan in 1941. This flower is known for its vibrant red color, which often makes it easy to spot. These lilies are common in meadows and semi-wooded areas.




