The Northern Lights, also known as the Aurora Borealis ... this natural phenomenon is a breathtaking sight to behold and we had the opportunity to experience the beauty this past week.

Some fascinating facts about Northern Lights:


- Best viewing time: Late August to early April, when the nights are dark enough to

view the spectacle.

- Peak season: December to March, when the nights are longest and darkest.
- Best viewing locations: head to areas with minimal light pollution, such as national parks, remote lakes, or designated dark-sky preserves.
- Colors: Shades of green, blue, and red, depending on the energy of the particles and altitude.
- Science behind it: Charged particles from the sun interact with Earth's magnetic field and atmosphere, causing the spectacular display.
- Indigenous significance: Many Indigenous cultures consider the Northern Lights a spiritual phenomenon, often associated with ancestors, spirits, or mystical powers.
- Photography tips: Use a tripod, wide-angle lens, and long exposure settings to capture the moment.

PROVINCE ENHANCING CANCER TREATMENT SAFETY THROUGH GENOTYPING



The Government of Saskatchewan, Saskatchewan Health Authority (SHA), and Saskatchewan Cancer Agency (SCA) are launching a genome testing program to improve the safety of Saskatchewan cancer patients receiving chemotherapy treatment.

Patients eligible for treatment with fluoropyrimidine-based drugs who may face severe or life-threatening side effects can now have in-province DPYD genotyping done before starting their treatment. This test identifies genetic variants in the DPYD

gene, which affects the production of the DPD (dihydropyrimidine dehydrogenase) enzyme.

"Screening for these genetic variants can help improve treatment outcomes for Saskatchewan cancer patients," Health Minister Everett Hindley said. "The introduction of DPYD genome testing shows our commitment to both precision medicine and patient safety. By making this a standard part of oncology practice, health-care providers can better manage treatment plans and potential complications."

BE BEAR AWARE THIS SUMMER



Summer is a great time for people to be outdoors, enjoying the weather and all that nature has to offer in our beautiful province. However, it's also an important time for black bears to maintain and build their fat stores in preparation for winter.

Black bears are common across much of Saskatchewan, and it is normal to see black bears in the wild.

They are intelligent and ruled by their stomachs; if they cannot find food in one area, they will move along to another. You can reduce the likelihood of human-bear conflict by keeping spaces such as yards and campsites free of attractants like garbage, un-cleaned barbecues, bird feeders and pet food.

CANADA AND SASKATCHEWAN ANNOUNCE MAJOR INVESTMENT TO PURCHASE MORE WILDFIRE EQUIPMENT AND INCREASE RESILIENCE TO WILDFIRES




With another challenging wildfire season underway and wildfires increasing in frequency and severity across Canada - impacting our health, economies, communities and wildlife - the Governments of Canada and Saskatchewan are supporting Canadians and residents of Saskatchewan who are threatened by wildfires. For the remainder of the 2024 wildfire season, Saskatchewan is forecasted to experience above-average wildfire activity.

Today, Federal Minister of Energy and Natural Resources Jonathan Wilkinson, with Saskatchewan Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Paul Merriman, announced a joint investment of over \$47.7 million over five years under the Government of Canada's Fighting and Managing Wildfires in a Changing Climate Program (FMWCC) Equipment Fund and the Resilient Communities through FireSmart (RCF) Program.

A joint investment of \$44.8 million through the FMWCC - Equipment Fund will support Saskatchewan's efforts to purchase wildland firefighting equipment such as handheld two-way radios, protection sprinklers and hoses, and flotation and protection pumps and pump kits. Both Canada and Saskatchewan are providing \$22.4 million each over five years. This funding will further improve fire management efforts in Saskatchewan by procuring and upgrading specialized wildland firefighting equipment and by hiring and training personnel to better prepare for and respond to wildfires. This will enhance safety for communities and firefighters and improve the sharing of resources across Canada. Funding is already flowing, and the province has purchased equipment that is already helping fire fighters in battling wildfires this season.

SASKATCHEWAN ADDS NEARLY 23,000 JOBS, LEADS NATION IN GROWTH



Statistics Canada Shows Historic Job Growth and Lowest Unemployment Rate in Canada

Statistics Canada's latest labour force numbers show that Saskatchewan added 22,900 new jobs year-over-year in the month of July, ranking second among provinces in terms of percentage change at 3.9 per cent. This is the largest number of jobs added year-over-year since July 2022. Saskatchewan has the lowest unemployment rate, seasonally adjusted, among provinces at 5.4 per cent, well below the national average of 6.4 per cent.

"Saskatchewan's lowest in the nation unemployment rate and record job growth continues to demonstrate the strength of our provincial economy " Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government will continue working alongside our job creators and making targeted investments to ensure we are filling the thousands of jobs being created across the province."

The Saskatoon Police Service announced the recovery of Mackenzie Lee Trottier, whose remains were discovered in the City of Saskatoon landfill on July 30.

"It is with heavy hearts that the Government of Saskatchewan extends its deepest condolences to the family and friends of Mackenzie Lee Trottier," Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Paul Merriman said. "We truly hope the Trottier family may now be able to find some closure amid this tragedy."

The investigation, which began on May 1 and was initially planned to last a month but was extended until her remains were fully recovered on Aug. 1, is estimated to have cost \$1.5 million. The Government of Saskatchewan will provide \$1 million to help cover the costs of the Saskatoon Police Service's investigation. We will work with the City of Saskatoon and the federal government to ensure their budget and ability to deliver high quality policing services are not impacted.




KidSport Saskatoon provides grants to help cover the costs of registration fees so that all kids ages 5-18 years in Saskatoon can play a season of sport.


