

REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



As the new year begins, our government remains committed to helping Saskatchewan people with affordability challenges. We wanted to remind you of some affordability measures available to Saskatchewan residents this year.

Starting January 1, 2024, SaskEnergy removed the federal carbon tax from natural gas home heating and SaskPower removed it from electrical home heating. This will result in savings for approximately 98 per cent of Saskatchewan families. The federal government's decision to exempt the carbon tax on home heating oil last fall left Saskatchewan families out in the cold; that's why our government is protecting Saskatchewan families' ability to afford to heat their homes this winter.

Customers will see a federal carbon tax charge on January's utility bills for natural gas or electricity used for heating in the month of December. For usage after January 1, 2024, the federal carbon tax will appear as both a charge and a reversal credit.

Also helping with affordability this year are Saskatchewan's low personal taxes and indexation. A family of four with an annual income of \$75,000 will save \$322 in 2024 as a result of indexing personal income tax. Indexation protects against bracket creep, which are the automatic increases in tax caused by inflation.

A family of four in Saskatchewan now pays no income tax on their first \$59,475 of income. When our

government took office in 2007, a family of four started paying income tax at \$26,150 of income. Reductions our government introduced have more than doubled the tax-free threshold.

Saskatchewan has among the lowest personal taxes in the country. Since 2007, our government's personal income tax exemptions have removed more than 112,000 people from the province's income tax roll.

Families in Saskatchewan with children enrolled in sports, arts and cultural activities will continue to be able to claim the Active Families Benefit on their tax returns. The benefit provides a refundable tax credit of \$150 per year, per child to eligible families. Families of children with a disability will receive an additional \$50 for a total tax credit of \$200 per year, per child.

The 2023 budget also provides targeted affordability measures to those who need it most.

Saskatchewan Income Supports and Saskatchewan Assured Income for Disability were both increased by six per cent, while the Seniors Income Plan benefit was increased by nine per cent.

Monthly personal care home benefits increased by 20 per cent and community-based organizations received an increase of three per cent in annual funding.

Every budget includes \$2 billion in affordability measures for Saskatchewan people. These programs, when combined with affordable housing, comparably low utility rates, indexation and low personal taxes demonstrate our government's commitment to helping keep life affordable for Saskatchewan people.

SASKATOON TO OPEN MORE ADDICTION TREATMENT SPACES



Mental Health and Addictions Minister Tim McLeod announced 14 new addictions treatment spaces at Possibilities Recovery Center in Saskatoon, almost doubling the number of provincial spaces available at the facility.

The new addictions treatment spaces include 10 for adults and four for youth.

"Building capacity to treat addictions is a priority for the Government of Saskatchewan," McLeod said. "These new spaces at Possibilities Recovery Center are part of our commitment to add 500 total addiction treatment spaces so Saskatchewan residents have more access to the care they need to recover from addictions."

The new spaces will help adults and youth access intensive outpatient treatment in person in Saskatoon or virtually across the province. The virtual option (available to adults) will further increase accessibility by allowing residents to receive treatment while carrying on with their day-to-day activities, such as working, school and caring for the family. The spaces will be open to all Saskatchewan residents.

"It is great to see this investment in mental health and addiction treatment in Saskatchewan,"

Possibilities Recovery Center Executive Director Tanner Perratt said. "Our waitlist grew quickly when we announced the first 18 spots and these additional spots are an answer to that demand. I'm very proud of our team for the work being done to provide and maintain a quality service."

LARGEST ADDICTIONS TREATMENT FACILITY IN SASKATCHEWAN TO OPEN NEAR LUMSDEN



In keeping with the Government of Saskatchewan's commitment to add 500 addictions treatment spaces across the province, a new 60-bed inpatient addictions treatment facility will be established at the former Living Skies Retreat & Conference Centre near Lumsden.

The new facility, located about 20 minutes northwest of Regina, will provide adults 18 and older with holistic, wrap-around inpatient addictions treatment for up to 16 weeks. The facility will be operated by EHN Canada through the publicly funded health care system.



"The Government of Saskatchewan is focused on getting people the treatment that they need to overcome addictions and live healthy lives in recovery," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Tim McLeod said. "Doubling the number of addictions treatment spaces across the province is a key pillar

of Saskatchewan's new Action Plan for Mental Health and Addictions."

Jack Brodsky has been named CTV Saskatoon's 2023 Citizen of the Year for his decades of work as a community builder who made a difference in the lives of countless youths.

Brodsky, who has lived in Saskatoon since the age of four, is a graduate of Aden Bowman Collegiate Institute. In 1978 he became a certified engineering technologist through SIAST, now known as Saskatchewan Polytechnic.

In the years that followed, Brodsky learned the family construction business while also learning, through his parents, the importance of giving back to the community.

Brodsky had been a co-owner of the Saskatoon Blades since 1976 and was an instrumental piece of developing a scholarship program for graduating Western Hockey League (WHL) players, before selling the team in 2013.

SASKATCHEWAN'S RECORD JOB GROWTH CONTINUES IN DECEMBER



22,100 Jobs Added Year-Over-Year, with Unemployment Rate at Five Per Cent

Statistic Canada's Labour Force Survey shows employment in Saskatchewan reached a record 600,200 in December 2023, adding 22,100 full time jobs year-over-year, ranking second among provinces in terms of percentage change at 3.8 per cent. Saskatchewan ends the year with a seasonally-adjusted unemployment rate of 5 per cent, below the national average of 5.8 per cent.

"Saskatchewan is seeing remarkable job growth numbers with records broken month after month," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. " This means more opportunity for Saskatchewan's people and a higher quality of life for our population. This growth doesn't just happen. This is the result of the government and employers working closely together to create the conditions for success. That is why the province is making strategic investments in growing our economy, including attracting investments worldwide through targeted initiatives, such as participating in COP 28 and the recent mission to Singapore and the Philippines, leading to a better quality of life for Saskatchewan people."




Applications for the Community Rink Affordability Grant Program close January 15, 2024.
