SASKATCHEWAN'S REMOVAL OF THE CARBON TAX LEADS TO LOWEST INFLATION RATE IN THE NATION



Consumer Price Index increases remain low due to carbon tax removal

In June 2024, Saskatchewan's Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 1.4 per cent compared to June 2023. This is tied with Manitoba for the lowest increase among the provinces.

"Saskatchewan has the lowest inflation rate in Canada as a direct result of our Government's refusal to collect and remit the carbon tax," Minister of Trade and Export Development Jeremy Harrison said. "We will continue to provide necessary relief for Saskatchewan families, while fighting back against the Trudeau/NDP coalition government as they threaten to have the Canada Revenue Agency unconstitutionally garnish money from our province's taxpayers. Our government will always stand up for Saskatchewan people."

We stopped them. The Government of Saskatchewan has been successful in preventing the federal government from its unconstitutional attempt to grab money out of Saskatchewan's bank account.

Only the Province can access Saskatchewan's Consolidated Revenue Fund. There can be no garnishment by the federal government.

The Province's bank account and general revenue fund are safe and sound, and all monies remain there, thanks to the Court's early intervention.

On June 26, Saskatchewan reached out to the CRA with alternatives to garnishing the Consolidated Revenue Fund of the Province. The CRA ignored those outreaches, and instead decided to garnishee the Province's fund, contrary to s. 126 of the Constitution.

We have now come to the very type of arrangement that could have been contemplated back in June. Saskatchewan has offered to establish a letter of credit, which is common practice for companies and other large entities and explicitly provided for under the federal carbon tax legislation. It will remain in place until our dispute is determined by the Tax Court of Canada.

Our arguments going forward remain the same: fair application of the law, minimum national standards, and no regional favouritism.

That means the Saskatchewan government will continue to provide the same carbon tax exemption on home heating that the Trudeau-NDP government is giving other parts of Canada.

And that exemption will remain in place until this federal government, or the next one, does the right thing and gets rid of the carbon tax on everyone and everything.

- The Parenting After Separation Program
- The Family Law Information Centre
- Intake Assessments

Each program has achieved successes by facilitating access to justice for families and mitigating the need for expensive court proceedings.

Heat waves bring extreme heat and humidity, posing serious risks. Stay safe with these tips:


- Keep cool: Use fans, A/C or seek shade.


CHILD CARE ACROSS SASKATCHEWAN





KNOW YOUR LIMIT, STAY WITHIN IT: CONSERVATION OFFICER COMPLIANCE CHECK RESULT IN 15 FINES



Saskatchewan conservation officers had two busy weekends this spring, conducting fisheries compliance checks on anglers at the Regina Beach pier on Last Mountain Lake.

Between May 18-19 and May 25-26, officers conducted checks on 168 anglers. The compliance checks uncovered a variety of violations, including:

- over-limit on walleye;
- over-limit on upper sized walleye;
- · using more than one line in open waters; and
- being more than 25 meters from a fishing line.

As a result of the inspections, officers issued 15 charges and seized 35 walleye.
