

YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT



Saskatchewan's economy is strong and our future is bright. According to Deloitte's Economic Outlook Summer 2024, "Saskatchewan's economy will be one of the country's leaders in growth over the near term as a recovery in the agriculture sector and very strong business investment propel real GDP growth of 1.6% this year and 4.3% next year."

The Conference Board of Canada solidifies this in Saskatchewan's Five-Year Outlook, stating "Saskatchewan's finances are still an envy of most other provinces." Our strong and growing economy makes Saskatchewan a great place to live, work and raise your family.

Inflation in Saskatchewan remains at about half the national rate, due in part to our government's decision to remove the carbon tax off home heating. Our inflation rate for June was 1.4 per cent, tied for the lowest among the provinces and about half the national rate of 2.7 per cent.

Just imagine how much that inflation rate would drop if the carbon tax was removed off everything for everyone. Our government will continue to provide the necessary relief for families while standing up for Saskatchewan people.

Private investment continues to fuel our province's strong economy as well. Cargill's new canola crush plant in Regina is now 50 per cent complete and expected to open sometime next year. This facility will help our province work towards the Growth Plan goal of crushing 75 per cent of the canola Saskatchewan produces right here in the province.

Saskatchewan has the food, fuel and fertilizer the world needs, including canola grown and processed right here at home. Processing facilities like these will add value to the canola our producers grow, create local jobs and support Saskatchewan's economic growth.

Saskatchewan fills first of 27 Recently Posted Nurse Practitioner Positions

The first of 27 new and permanent Nurse Practitioner positions available across rural, remote and regional areas of Saskatchewan has been hired in Maple Creek and will begin working this week.

"It's another positive step forward for the Maple Creek community to officially welcome an added Nurse Practitioner to their team of health care professionals," Minister of Health Everett Hindley said. "The application and hiring process for the remaining positions is currently ongoing. I encourage all qualified NPs to consider applying for one of the many job opportunities available across Saskatchewan."

NPs are registered nurses with additional training to support a higher scope of practice, and working within a primary care team, can provide many of the same services as family physicians, including;

- Advanced assessments, diagnosis, and treatment of acute and chronic illness;
- Ordering diagnostic tests;
- Admitting and discharging patients;
- Prescribing medications;
- Performing medical procedures; and
- Providing referrals to specialist services.

SASKATCHEWAN CONTINUES TO LEAD THE NATION IN RETAIL TRADE



Statistics Canada released retail trade figures for May 2024, which placed Saskatchewan first in the nation for year-over-year growth. The province's retail trade sales increased by 6.1 per cent, totaling \$2.2 billion in May 2024 (seasonally adjusted), compared to May 2023.

SASKATCHEWAN SEES SURGE INBULDING CONSTRUCTION INVESTMENT



Province Sees 12.9 Per Cent Increase in Year-over-year Growth

According to the most recent Statistics Canada data, Saskatchewan saw a 12.9 per cent increase in building construction investments from May 2023 to May 2024 (seasonally-adjusted). This investment highlights the province's strong economic environment and ongoing commitment to fostering growth and development.

"Saskatchewan's economy continues to show it's significant strength as we attract investment from businesses looking to build and expand," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Saskatchewan's surge in building construction investments shows industry's confidence in our province's competitive business environment which promotes innovation and provides investor certainty. This economic growth is creating good jobs in communities across the province, and allows our government to invest in the areas that matter most to Saskatchewan people"

SASKATCHEWAN'S AA (LOW) CREDIT RATING AFFIRMED BY MORNINGSTAR DBRS



In its recent release, Morningstar DBRS affirms the province's AA (low) credit rating and stable outlook.

Saskatchewan currently has the second-highest credit rating among the provinces when all three major rating agencies (Moody's, Morningstar DBRS, and S&P) are considered. In June 2024, S&P Global Ratings gave Saskatchewan the highest credit rating among Canadian provinces.

"Saskatchewan's economy is stable, and our province remains one of the most affordable places in the nation to invest, live, work and raise a family," Deputy Premier and Minister of Finance Donna Harpauer said. "The Morningstar DBRS report and affirmation is encouraging and speaks to our strengths."

Statistics Canada's latest GDP numbers indicate that Saskatchewan's 2023 real GDP reached an all-time high of \$77.9 billion, increasing by \$1.2 billion, or 1.6 per cent. This places Saskatchewan second in the nation for real GDP growth, above the national average of 1.2 per cent.

In June 2024, Saskatchewan's Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 1.4 per cent compared to June 2023. This is tied with Manitoba for the lowest increase among the provinces.

CHEER ON SASKATCHEWAN THIS SUMMER AT THE PARIS OLYMPICS



Following years of dedication to sport through the grassroots level to high performance, 23 individuals from Saskatchewan will represent the province at the Olympic Summer Games July 26 to August 11 in Paris.


The contingent will feature three support and mission staff, five coaches and 15 athletes with ties to the province.

Humboldt's Paige Crozon will not only be making her Olympic debut in women's 3x3 basketball, but this will also mark the first time a Canadian team has qualified in the event on either the men's or women's side.

Joining her and making their second-straight appearances at the Games will be Pike Lake diver Rylan Wiens, who will take part in both the men's 10-metre individual and synchronized events, and Regina artistic swimming co-captain Kenzie Priddell.

Women leaving custody often face challenges as they work to reintegrate back into their communities and reunite with their children and loved ones. Elizabeth Fry Society will help clients navigate the programs and services that are currently available in Saskatchewan, helping them to secure affordable housing, mental health and

addiction supports, income assistance, pre-employment services, family reunification efforts, and transportation, so they can lead healthier lives free from criminal activity.




