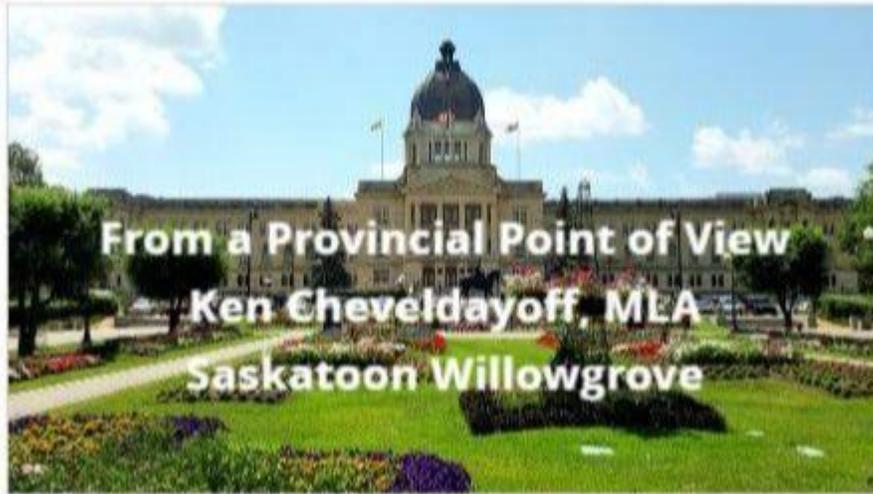
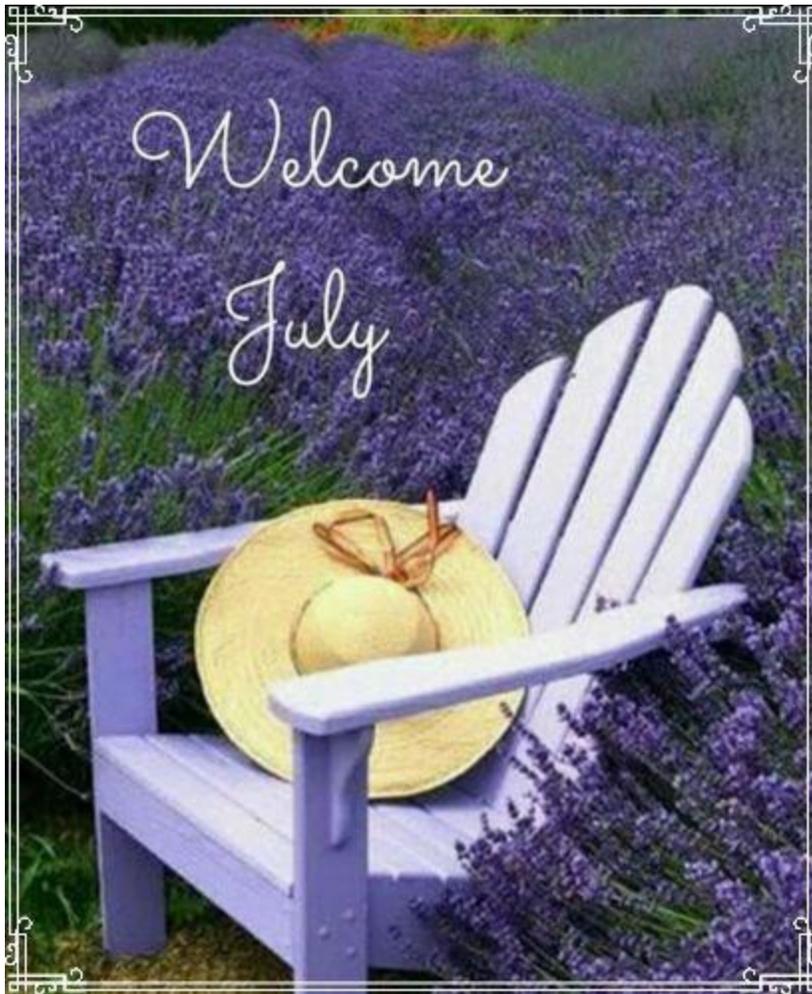

WISHING EVERYONE A GREAT START TO SUMMER!



Summer is a great time for being active. Even if you live where it gets hot or humid, there are ways you can stay active and stay safe.

If the temperature is lower than 27°C (80°F), you usually can be active outside without taking extra precautions. It depends on how active you already are and how used to hot weather you are. But anytime you exercise, it's a good idea to take these normal precautions.



- **Drink plenty of water.**

You lose fluid when you are active. If you lose too much, it can result in dehydration, muscle cramps, or even heat exhaustion. In hot weather, drink plenty of fluids before, during, and after activity.

For longer exercise periods, sports drinks contain carbohydrates and minerals called electrolytes that may help prevent dehydration.

- **Don't exercise as hard when it's hot.**

Take rest breaks. Exercise more slowly than usual or for a shorter time.

- **Stay in the shade when you can.**
- **Wear light-coloured, breathable clothes.**
- **Always wear sunscreen.**
- **Watch for signs of dehydration and heat-related illnesses such as heat exhaustion and heatstroke.**

Signs of [dehydration](#) include having a dry mouth and eyes and feeling dizzy.

If you are overweight, have health problems, take medicines, or use alcohol, you may be at a higher risk for heat-related illness. You may also have trouble if you are not used to exercising in warmer weather.

Older adults and children are at a higher risk for heat-related illness and should be extra cautious. Remind children to drink plenty of fluids before, during, and after activity.

When it's hot and humid out, take extra precautions when you're active. This might mean you change your activity or when you choose to do it. Here are some ideas you can try.

- Take morning or evening walks.

Walking the dog or walking with a partner helps you make it part of your routine.

- Go for a bike ride.

Find shaded areas, and ride during cooler times of day.

CONSTRUCTION BEGINS ON TWO NEW GROUP HOMES FOR YOUTH IN SASKATOON



It was a pleasure to join Social Services Minister Terry Jenson at the announcement that construction begins on two new group homes for youth in Saskatoon.

Youth in Saskatoon experiencing mental health challenges or facing addiction will soon have additional access to safe, supportive housing. The Government of Canada, Government of Saskatchewan, and other funding partners are supporting EGADZ to expand its Retreat Homes program through a \$1.5 million investment to construct two five-space group homes that will provide 24-hour care, cultural support, and a youth-centered recovery program for male and female youth.



"This investment is about delivering for vulnerable youth in Saskatoon who need safe and supportive places to call home," Social Services Minister Terry Jenson said. "By working together with EGADZ and our community partners, we are helping to build places of safety, stability and healing. These new group homes will offer young people the support they need to recover, rebuild and look forward to a brighter future."

SASKATCHEWAN JOINS ALBERTA IN CHALLENGING FEDERAL IMPACT ASSESSMENT ACT



Saskatchewan is intervening in support of Alberta's legal action to challenge the federal *Impact Assessment Act* before the Alberta Court of Appeal.

On October 13, 2023, the Supreme Court of Canada ruled in a 5-2 decision that the *Impact Assessment Act* was a clear example of federal government overreach into provincial jurisdiction. In response to the decision, former Prime Minister Justin Trudeau passed amendments to the *Impact Assessment Act* in June 2024.

The Constitution Act, 1867 provides the provinces with exclusive jurisdiction over the development of natural resources. Amendments to the *Impact Assessment Act* made in 2024 do not go far enough to protect Saskatchewan from federal government overreach into provincial jurisdiction.

"Saskatchewan supports Prime Minister Carney's goal of Canada becoming an energy superpower, and we will continue to work with the federal government in adopting our Strong Saskatchewan, Strong Canada plan," Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim

McLeod, K.C. said. "However, the current Impact Assessment Act is a major roadblock in achieving that goal. We remain committed to standing up for resource development across Canada, particularly in resource-rich western provinces like Saskatchewan and Alberta."

Fireworks can be fun, but they are not toys. Mishandling them can cause serious injuries or fires. If you're planning to light fireworks, make safety non-negotiable.

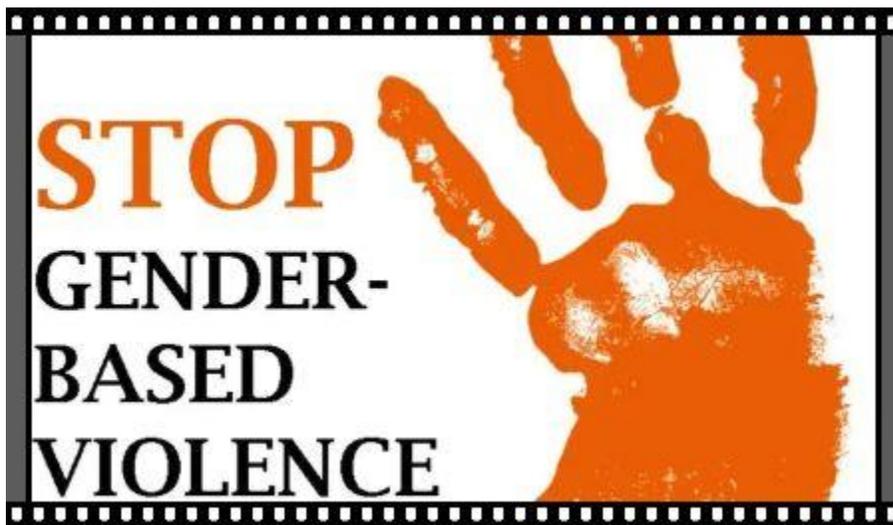
- ✔ Read and follow the manufacturer's instructions — no shortcuts.

GOVERNMENT ANNOUNCES OVER \$640,000 IN ADDITIONAL INVESTMENTS TO ADDRESS GENDER BASED VIOLENCE



The Government of Saskatchewan continues to implement the National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence with a new investment of over \$640,000 to support four unique initiatives administered by community-based organizations and the agencies that support them. These funds are in addition to the \$3.8 million provided to 16 agencies across Saskatchewan announced in early 2025.

The National Action Plan to End Gender-based Violence is a ten-year collaborative framework for a national approach to ending gender-based violence. The Government of Canada has provided Saskatchewan \$20.3 million over four years to implement new initiatives that create opportunities for action.

"We are proud to empower and support community-based organizations across the province as they create programs, provide services and research new practices to build

safe communities," Justice Minister and Attorney General Tim McLeod, K.C. said. "This increased investment will strengthen outreach and provide families with the tools they need to build a successful path forward."

- **Woods and Water** - Photography that features Saskatchewan's abundant lakes and rivers, as well as Saskatchewan's diverse forests and trees, from lodgepole pine and aspen groves in the south to the northern boreal forests.
