FREE FISHING WEEKEND!



Angling limits and all other sport fishing laws are in effect, all of which can be found in the Saskatchewan Anglers Guide. If anglers wish to take fish out of Saskatchewan, they must purchase a license. Free Fishing Weekend does not apply in national parks in the province. For more information check out the Saskatchewan Anglers Guide.

With the fishing season well underway, the Ministry of Environment is reminding anglers to know your limit and stay within it when out on Saskatchewan waters.

Saskatchewan angling regulations set daily limits for the maximum amount and size of fish that can be caught and retained in most waters. Certain waterbodies will also have specific limits for that location or catch-and-release limits that have been established for certain fish species.




SASKATCHEWAN'S ECONOMY IS STRONG

Crops are quickly progressing in the province with the warm temperatures and widespread rain received this past week. The sight of yellow canola and green wheat fields is now prominent on the landscape across Saskatchewan. Producers made substantial haying progress this past week. Although rain was received across the province, many areas need more to keep moisture levels adequate.

Generally, this week, the north received more rain than the south. The Odessa area, however, recorded the most rain received for the week with 42 mm. Prince Albert and Turtleford also received significant amounts of rainfall with 40 and 37 mm, respectively. Although rain was received, warm temperatures meant it didn't stay long and soil moisture began to diminish. Cropland topsoil moisture is rated as one per cent surplus, 42 per cent adequate, 42 per cent short, and 15 per cent very short. Hay and pasture topsoil moisture follows a similar pattern with 36 per cent adequate, 42 per cent short and 21 per cent very short. Topsoil moisture levels in the southwest and west central are the lowest for the province.

SASKATCHEWAN SEES RECORD ORGAN AND TISSUE DONATION



ICYMI: Yesterday, the <u>Government of Saskatchewan</u> made an announcement about organ and tissue donation numbers in our province. In the period from April 1, 2022 to March 31, 2023 there were 46 adult kidney transplants, the second highest ever to be performed in the province, and 276 patients who donated ocular tissue, which helps to enhance sight for Saskatchewan residents.

To the all the families of these individuals who made the decision to donate organs or tissues, thank you. Your decision has saved or significantly enhanced the life of another.

"It's an honour to be a part of these modern medical miracles, but it's the organ donors who make it all possible, whether they've talked to their loved ones about their wishes or donated as living donors," said Saskatoon transplant surgeon, Dr. Michael Moser. "Without these organ donor heroes, transplantation wouldn't be possible."




