



YXE URBAN GAMES IN SASKATOON AUGUST 16-18



YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT



Our government was proud to attend the Saskatchewan Oil and Gas Show to celebrate the province's oil and gas sector. The oil and gas sector is critical to our province's economy; the value of oil and gas production in our province totalled \$13.5 billion in 2023.

Saskatchewan's oil and gas industry is environmentally responsible as well. In fact, if other other-producing countries in the world adopted environmental regulations likeSaskatchewan's, greenhouse gas emissions would be cut by an estimated 25%. That's a story we should be telling the world, not making it illegal to even talk about it – which is exactly what the federal Liberal-NDP government is trying to do.

The federal government's Bill C-59 includes amendments to the Competition Act that will penalize energy companies for asserting their environmental records without "adequate and proper substantiation in accordance with internationally-recognized methodology, the proof of which lies on the person making the representation."

This legislation would allow environmental activists to 'complaint swarm' and bring applications to the Competition Tribunal. These complaints could result in companies being fined as much as \$10-15 million simply for advertising their sustainability records or defending the energy sector.

The Trudeau government has essentially taken NDP MP Charlie Angus' private members bill, The Fossil Fuels Advertising Act, and incorporated it into legislation.

This bill would effectively act as a gag law on one of Saskatchewan's most important economic industries, forcing energy companies to face scrutiny unique in the business world. Provincial Minister of Justice and Attorney General Bronwyn Eyre wrote to the federal government to express Saskatchewan's profound alarm at this proposed legislation. We will explore all options to fight Bill C-59, including the Saskatchewan First Act.

Our government will always stand up for and defend the oil and gas sector, and the 26,000 Saskatchewan workers and families who depend on jobs created by the industry. It's just a shame that the federal Liberals and the NDP won't do the same.

As our government continues to promote and grow the oil and gas industry here in Saskatchewan, we are committed to providing opportunities for our students to learn about the industry as well. In a new partnership between the Saskatchewan Distance Learning Centre (Sask DLC) and Teine Energy, new Oil & Gas high school courses will be offered to students.

These courses will allow students to learn about the importance of our oil and gas industry and gain knowledge about career opportunities available in Saskatchewan's energy industry.


Meanwhile, local companies will receive support in building a future workforce to meet consumer demands.



CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF MAY 28 TO JUNE 3, 2024



Seeding progress greatly advanced over the past week despite rain delays throughout the province. Seeding progress is now 94 per cent complete, up from 77 per cent last week. This falls behind both the five-year and ten-year average of 97 per cent.

The southeast and southwest are the furthest advanced at 96 per cent complete. The northwest is 93 per cent complete, followed closely by the east-central, west-central and northeast regions which all report 92 per cent complete.


Provincially, seeding is nearly complete for field peas, lentils, spring wheat and durum. Mustard, triticale and perennial forage are the furthest behind in seeding progress.

# SASKATCHEWAN'S TOURISM INDUSTRY CONTINUES TO GROW

Recent domestic and international visitation figures show that Saskatchewan's tourism industry is on the path to growth.

The latest data released by Statistics Canada demonstrate a strong increase in tourism expenditures in Saskatchewan. Travel spending reached almost \$2.85 billion in 2023, outpacing the \$2.4 billion in spending that was generated in 2022. Similarly, hotel occupancy rates and revenue for 2023 showed significant growth over the previous year.



Domestic travel is also showing strong numbers. Saskatchewan experienced 21 per cent growth in overnight visitation in 2023, the most out of all Canadian provinces.

"Saskatchewan's tourism industry is continuing to grow our economy, create new jobs and provide one-of-a-kind experiences to visitors coming to our province," Minister Responsible for Tourism Saskatchewan Jeremy Harrison said. "Our government set an ambitious target in the Saskatchewan Growth Plan for a 50 per cent increase in annual tourism expenditures by the year 2030. These latest figures show that our tourism industry is on track to achieving that goal."



In addition to domestic travel, visitation from the United States has increased, with 2023 figures showing a 54 per cent increase in U.S. travelers by car. With the reintroduction of an air route between Minneapolis and Saskatoon, air arrivals increased by 46 per cent in 2023. In addition, fishing and hunting license sales rose by 26 per cent over 2022.

"The tourism industry was heavily affected by the downturn in travel over the last few years, not only within the province but on a national and international level," Tourism Saskatchewan CEO Jonathan Potts said. "The latest figures released by Statistics Canada, along with other positive indicators, demonstrate that tourism in our province is on the upswing. Our organization is focused on reaching the goal set out in the Saskatchewan Growth Plan to assist the tourism industry in achieving \$3.6 billion in annual travel spending by 2030. The efforts of our industry partners, with support from sound research and innovative strategies, will help get us there. It is gratifying to see that people are embracing Saskatchewan as an enticing destination."



The Conference Board of Canada predicts that tourism revenues will continue to increase. Longterm, the Conference Board of Canada estimates that Saskatchewan will reach approximately \$3.57 billion in annual visitor expenditures in 2028.






