Today, I was pleased to join Mayor Clark to celebrate two significant achievements in our city. Congratulations to the City of Saskatoon for completing two critical projects. Together, we are investing in infrastructure that builds and protects our city and province.

We recognized the completion and grand opening of the Northeast Sector-Evergreen Reservoir and the Spadina Life Station. These important projects add capacity and longevity to Saskatoon's water systems

Our government is proud to have played a role in bring both these projects to life. The Spadina Life Station, built in the 1940's had reached the end of it's lifespan. The new system will help move more than 60% of collected wastewater upstream, where it will be treated. Under the

**Investing in Canada Infrastructure Program, your provincial government contributed more than \$5.0 million to the Spadina Lift Station.**



I had the opportunity to recognize the contributions made towards the construction of the Northeast Sector-Evergreen Reservoir, which received more than \$14.6 million from the provincial government through the National and Regional Projects program of the New Building Canada Fund. This new facility has the water capacity of 17 Olympic-size swimming pools and marks the fourth reservoir in Saskatoon that collects water from the Water Treatment Plant and stores it for distribution to neighbourhoods like Evergreen, Aspen Ridge, and Willowgrove.

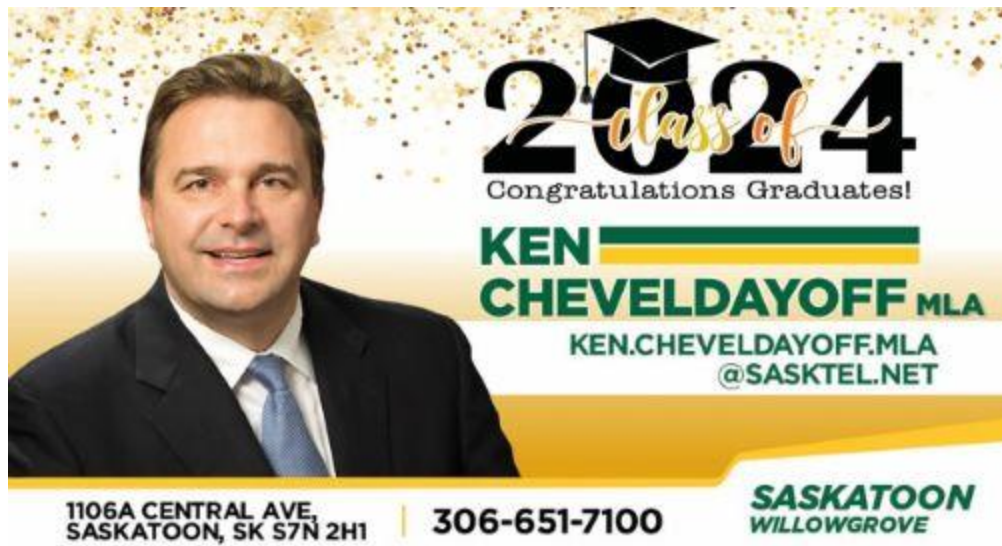

**JUNE IS AN EXCITING MONTH FOR GRADUATES!**



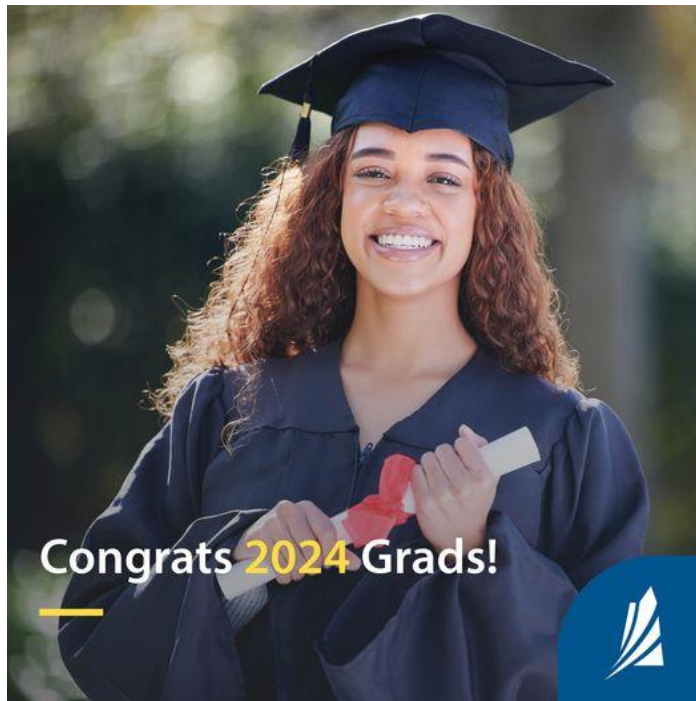

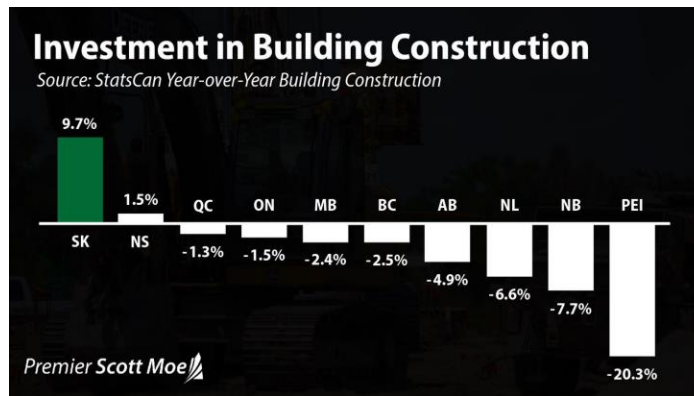

## **SASKATCHEWAN LEADS THE NATION IN BUILDING CONSTRUCTION INVESTMENT**



According to the latest data from Statistics Canada, Saskatchewan ranks first in the nation in building construction investment with a 9.7 per cent increase in April 2024 compared to March 2024 (seasonally-adjusted). These figures highlight the province's thriving economic landscape and its commitment to fostering growth and development.

*Saskatchewan Filled all Family Medicine Seats in the First Round of CaRMS*

The Canadian Resident Matching Service (CaRMS) has released the match results of the process to fill medical residency seats across the country for 2024. For a second consecutive year, Saskatchewan filled all family medicine seats in the first round of the CaRMS match.

Each year, Canadian medical students expecting to graduate have two opportunities to be matched to a post-graduate (residency) seat at a Canadian medical school through the CaRMS two-round match process.

All of the 135 seats posted in Saskatchewan this year by the University of Saskatchewan (U of S) for family medicine and specialty programs have been filled, a large majority in the first round of the match. Seats for specialty programs were all filled by the second round. The Anesthesia program was expanded to Regina and a new provincial Dermatology program located in Regina is offered as well. Both programs will begin to train residents on July 1, 2024.

“This was a record year for the number of Saskatchewan medical graduates matched through CaRMS to the University of Saskatchewan, demonstrating the strength and attractiveness of these medical programs in the province,” Health Minister Everett Hindley said. “Our government is committed to ensuring Saskatchewan is an attractive place to study and work for students and graduates by offering ample training and employment opportunities.”

## CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD OF JUNE 4 - JUNE 10, 2024



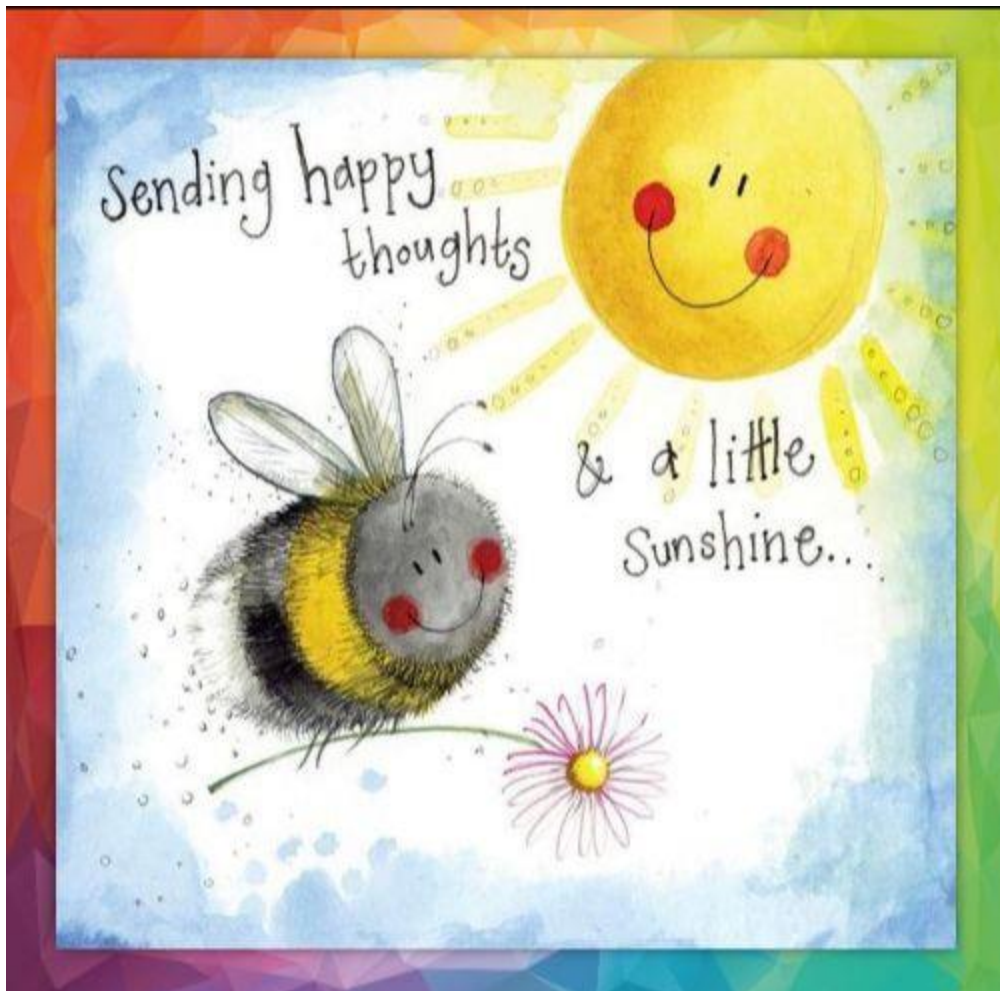
Provincially, most producers have completed their seeding operations with 98 per cent of the 2024 crop seeded. Rain continued to hinder seeding operations in the northeast and east-central parts of the province. Some producers have indicated their acres may not be able to be seeded this year due to the excess moisture in some areas.

Rain fell throughout the province over the last week with the northeast region receiving the highest amounts. The Lake Lenore area reported the highest rainfall amount at 81 mm followed by the Arborfield area at 78 mm and the Duck Lake area at 76 mm. Regions that have received increased precipitation have noted that the heavy rainfall has caused water to collect in lower lying areas with crop flooding occurring.

Saskatchewan students will soon have more opportunities to train at home through two new domestic health care programs. In 2024-25, the Government of Saskatchewan is investing approximately \$8.1 million to establish the Occupational Therapy Program and Speech Language Pathology Training Program at the University of Saskatchewan (USask).

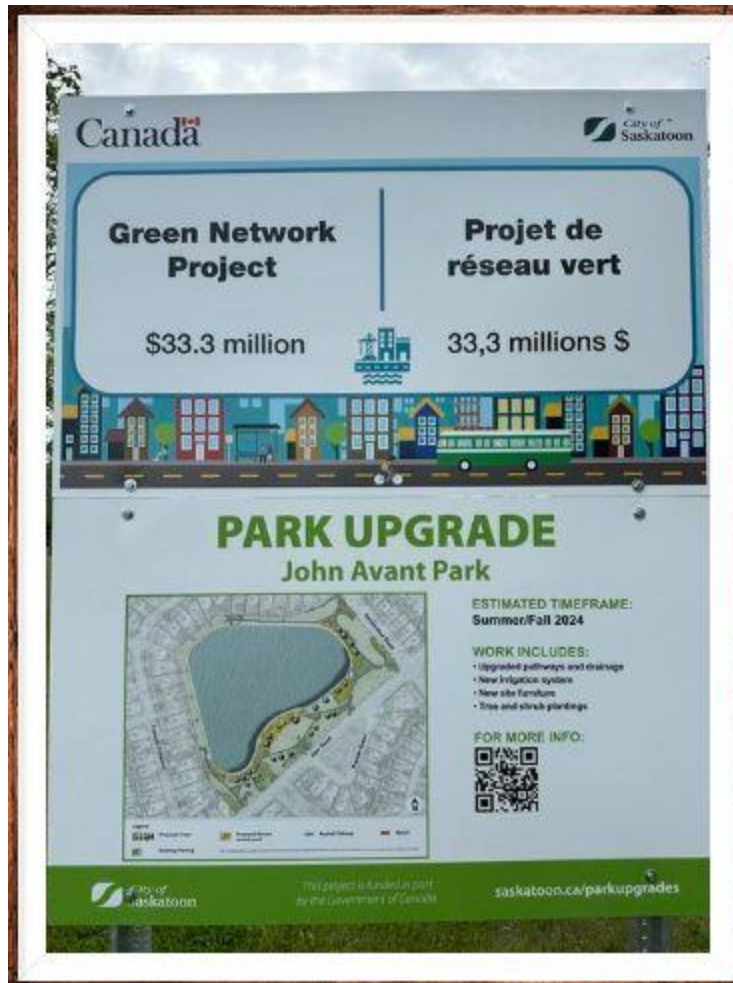

"Establishing these programs in-province will give more students the opportunity to train closer to home and make it easier to retain our grads here in Saskatchewan."

"A key pillar of our Health Human Resources Action Plan is to create training opportunities here at home for Saskatchewan students

Students have two years to redeem the scholarship by successfully completing a post-secondary training program in a trade designated in Saskatchewan or by registering as an apprentice in Saskatchewan and successfully completing Level One technical training.

## **INNOVATION SASKATCHEWAN INVESTS \$600,000 IN USASK LED HAWC SCIENCE MISSION THROUGH ISF PROGRAM**



Innovation Saskatchewan is investing \$600,000 over three years through the Innovation and Science Fund (ISF) for a project supporting the HAWC (High-altitude Aerosol, Water vapor, and Cloud) satellite mission. HAWC is the Canadian Space Agency's contribution to the Atmosphere Observing System (AOS) mission led by NASA slated to launch in 2031. ISF matches federal innovation funding dollars for projects from Saskatchewan universities, colleges and research institutes.

The program funding will help HAWC advance Canadian space science through the development of advanced technological space instruments. Co-led by a team of talented USask researchers, HAWC will deliver critical measurements to support extreme weather prediction, climate modelling and disaster monitoring. Further, it provides new data for scientists to better analyze, interpret and understand factors contributing to climate change.
