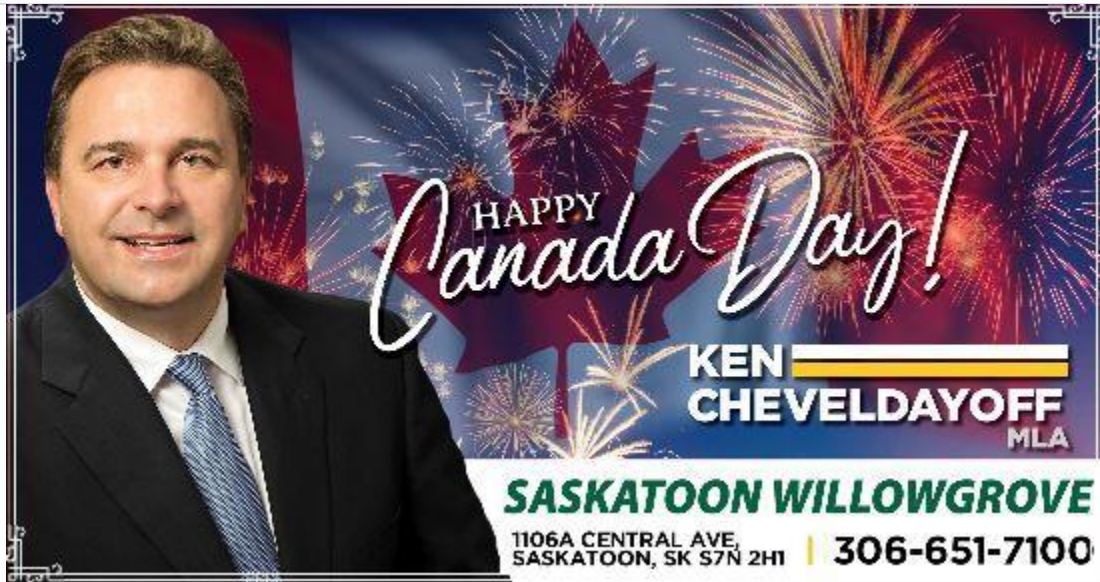

CARBON TAX REMOVAL KEEPS SASKATCHEWAN INFLATION RATE AT SECOND LOWEST IN NATION



In May 2024, Saskatchewan's Consumer Price Index (CPI) increased by 1.5 per cent compared to May 2023. This is the second lowest rise among the provinces and significantly lower than the national average of 2.9 per cent.

"Our Government will continue to stand up for Saskatchewan with the elimination of the carbon tax on home heating as a significant measure in the fight to tackle inflation," Minister of Trade & Export Development Jeremy Harrison said. "The federal carbon tax negatively impacts the interests of this province and the people who live here. Our priority will always be the defense of our economic well-being against the out of touch federal Liberal/NDP coalition government."

SUMMER SAFETY TIP



When is hot, too hot?

Ignoring these serious symptoms can lead to coma or death

Heat Stroke
high body temp, absence of sweating, headache, red/flushed dry skin, rapid pulse, difficulty breathing, strange behaviour, hallucinations, confusion, agitation, disorientation, and/or seizure
Call 911

Heat Exhaustion
nausea, vomiting, fatigue, pale skin, weakness, headache, muscle cramps, aches, and dizziness
Get out of heat immediately, drink fluids (avoid caffeine or alcohol) and apply cooling measures (ice or fans)

There will be many hot days this summer in Saskatchewan. The best defense is prevention...drink lots of fluids and find some shade. Make sure to pay attention to your body - too much heat can be dangerous, especially for children and seniors.

-Canada Day is celebrated every 1st July.

-Canada Day was first celebrated on July 1, 1867.

-The passing of the Constitution Act, 1867 also occurred on July 1, 1867. It is one of the most important constitutions in Canada.

- In 1982, or more than 100 years later after the holiday's first celebration, Dominion Day became Canada Day.

- Patriated by the Canada Act 1982, Dominion Day became Canada Day since the political process changed to full Canadian sovereignty.

SASKATCHEWAN LEADS THE NATION IN RETAIL TRADE

Saskatchewan *Leads the Nation* in Retail Trade

Retail sales in the province ***surged by 8.5 per cent,***
totaling \$2.2 billion in April 2024 (seasonally-adjusted),
compared to last year.



Saskatchewan's nation-leading retail trade numbers show the provincial economy is strong and continuing to grow. Our retailers are meeting consumer demands and driving significant economic growth. This in turn is creating more jobs and opportunities for the people of our province.

**PADDLEBOARD, KAYAK, JET SKI, CANOE - WATERCRAFT
INSPECTION MEANS YOU, TOO!**



Boating season is here again - finally! While everyone's anxious to get to the lake, it's important to stop at all provincial watercraft inspection stations you encounter while traveling and do your part to keep Saskatchewan free of aquatic invasive species (AIS). And remember: Non-motorized equipment such as kayaks, canoes and paddleboards are also considered watercraft and must be inspected.

Even if you're just passing through the province, or were already inspected in another province or state, you are required to stop at all inspection stations you encounter. Saskatchewan co-ordinates its inspection efforts with neighbouring provinces, states and the Canada Border Services Agency. When crossing provincial and international borders, look for inspection stations along highways and near waterbodies from early May to late October.

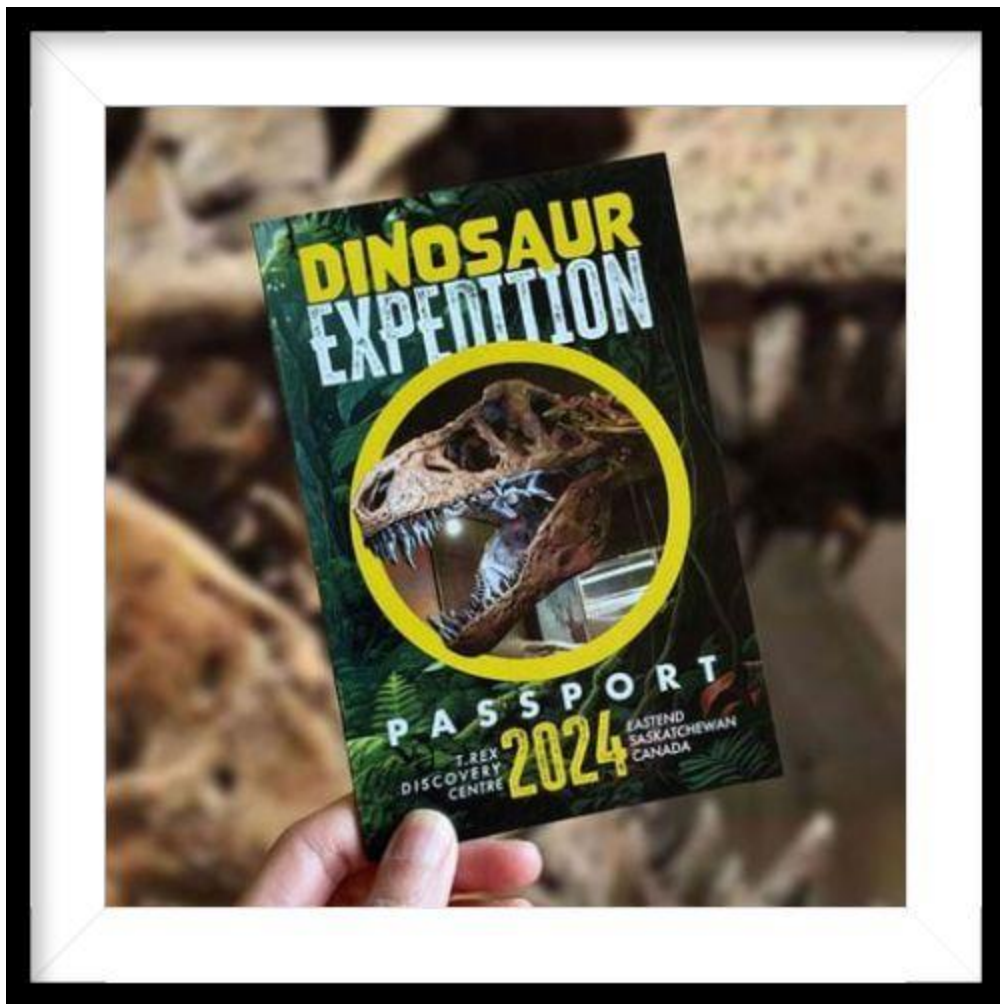

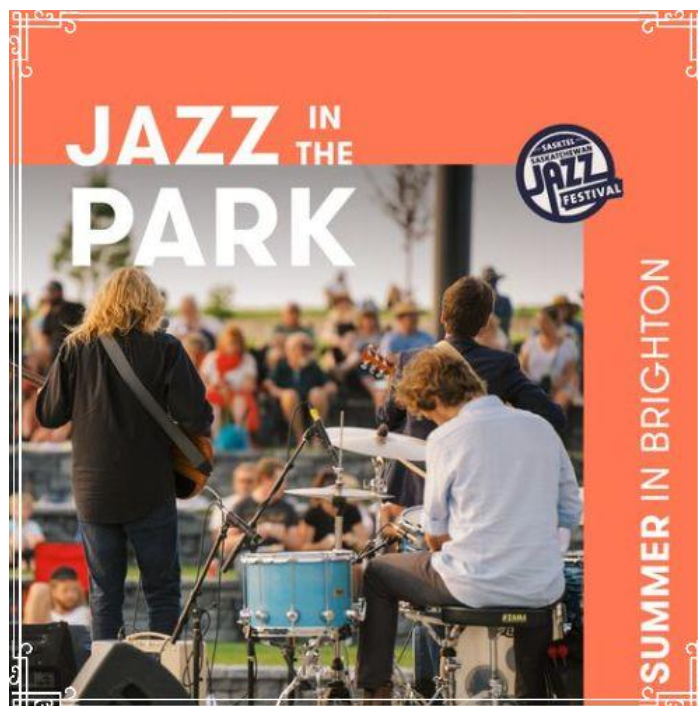

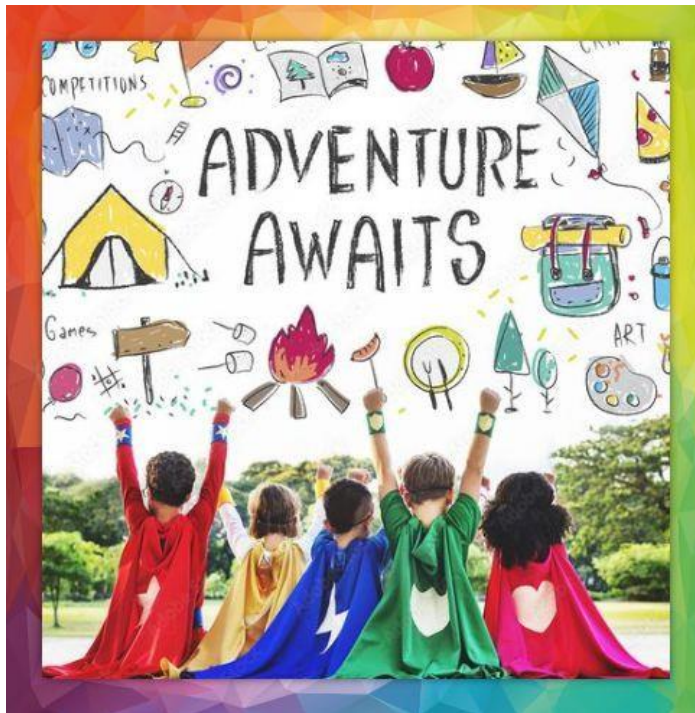
