Seasonally Adjusted Unemployment Rate Reached 4.8 per cent; 5,600 Jobs Created Year-Over-Year

Newly released labour force numbers from Statistics Canada for April show strong, continued growth in Saskatchewan's economy, with 5,600 new jobs when compared to April 2022. All job growth was full time employment.



"Saskatchewan continues to impress with even more job growth in the face of national economic uncertainty, with 5,600 new jobs and the second lowest provincial unemployment rate," Immigration and Career Training Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "With 25 months of consistent job growth, year-to-date merchandise and wholesale trade exports both up 30 per cent, and over 50 per cent increase to urban housing starts, Saskatchewan is proud of the story it has to tell of growth that works for everyone."

ST. PAUL'S HOSPITAL FRONT ENTRANCE PROJECT PROCEEDING TO REQUEST FOR PROPOSALS



Two teams will move forward to the next stage of procurement for the St. Paul's Hospital Front Entrance Project. The project's scope includes an 8,353 ft² expansion, consisting of a fully accessible and expanded front entrance, First Nations and Cultural Centre, and relocated gift shop. The project also includes 6,609 ft² of interior renovations supporting Information and Security, Patient Registration, and additional washrooms.

"Our government is pleased to support the St. Paul's front entrance project," Health Minister Paul Merriman said. "The renovations will enhance the safety and accessibility for patients and visitors while also improving architectural appearance and integrity of the century-old building. The First Nation and Métis Cultural Centre will be a welcome addition to better meet patients' cultural needs while accessing care."

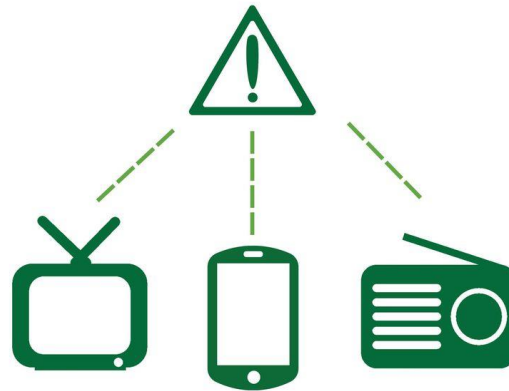


The SPSA will also conduct a test of the SaskAlert system at approximately 1:55 p.m. on Wednesday, May 10. SaskAlert provides critical information on emergencies in real time, so people in the province can take action to protect themselves and their community.

"Regular testing of the system helps ensure that, in times of an emergency or disaster, urgent and lifesaving warnings can be distributed to the public by emergency management offices and other agencies, ministries and Crowns," Corrections, Policing and Public Safety Minister Christine Tell said.

Not all mobile devices will receive the test alert since some devices are not compatible or the device software may not be up to date. For more information, visit saskalert.ca or contact your telecommunications provider.

SUICIDE PREVENTION PLAN MARKS THREE-YEAR ANNIVERSARY WITH PROGRESS UPDATE

The Government of Saskatchewan is providing an update on suicide prevention initiatives as part of the three-year anniversary of *Pillars for Life: The Saskatchewan Suicide Prevention Plan*.

Released May 8, 2020, *Pillars for Life* serves as a guide to coordinate activities to promote life and reduce risk factors related to suicide.

"The tragic loss of one person to suicide is one person too many," Mental Health and Addictions Minister Everett Hindley said. "Suicide prevention is not a one-size-fits-all approach. Our *Pillars for Life* plan is making progress on a number of initiatives with groups and organizations across our province to support the mental health of Saskatchewan residents."

RECAP - IF YOU MISSED THE NEWS IN OUR LAST NEWSLETTER



Our government continues to work to improve safety for communities and people across the province. The recently passed 2023-24 Provincial Budget includes important investments in safety for Saskatchewan communities.

Investments of \$968.5 million will enhance the protection of persons and property across the province; included in this investment is the establishment of the new Saskatchewan Marshals Service (SMS). Consisting of about 70 officers, the SMS will support RCMP and municipal forces with a focus on rural and remote areas.

Expansions to Saskatchewan's Crime Reduction Teams (CRT) and Warrant Enforcement and Suppression Teams (WEST) will also be funded to build on ongoing successes. Over the past year, these teams have apprehended numerous violent offenders and removed drugs and guns from our communities, helping make our province safer. The province's third WEST unit will be established in Prince Albert this year, and a new CRT unit in the Battlefords region will join the other nine units across the province.

Our government continues to invest in initiatives to reduce the criminal use of firearms while protecting the rights of law-abiding gun owners. This year's budget includes funding to administer the recently-passed *Saskatchewan Firearms Act*, which regulates licensing, storage, transportation and carrying of firearms. A provincial firearms regulatory system will be established to promote the safe and responsible use of firearms. The Act will also regulate seizure of firearms by federal government agents and ensure fair compensation for those firearms being seized. Ultimately, the Act will enhance public safety while supporting responsible firearms use and ownership.

As we approach fire season, the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) has invested in a new

water-scooping air tanker to help provide a stronger wildfire response. The new CL-215T will join a fleet of air tankers and bird-dog planes as part of the province's fire response program. This year's budget also invests in reopening the Parkland College firefighter training program in Melville, which will address the demand for firefighters across the province.

This budget includes an \$8.8 million increase in annual funding to enhance Emergency Medical Services (EMS) in 31 communities across the province. This investment will help stabilize emergency services and modernize the system across the province. EMS providers in our communities are on the frontlines of patient care, a priority area for our government.

For survivors of interpersonal and sexual violence, the budget includes \$27.5 million in supports and services. This includes funding to support second stage housing, including intervention and counselling services, for women and their children leaving interpersonal violence and abuse. This funding will be allocated to five community-based organizations across the province that do important work to support survivors. Violence and abuse have no place in our communities, and ensuring survivors have access to safe services is part of improving community safety across the province.

Investments in initiatives that help keep Saskatchewan communities and people safe ensure our province remains one of the best places to live, work and raise a family. MERCHANDISE EXPORTS SEE CONTINUED GROWTH IN SASKATCHEWAN



May 4, Statistics Canada is reporting more growth for Saskatchewan's economy. Merchandise exports have increased 13.4 per cent in March 2023 compared to February 2023, while year-over-year the province saw a 9.0 per cent increase.

In the first three months of 2023, Saskatchewan saw the third highest increase in the nation with a 29.5 per cent jump, compared to the same period in 2022.

"It's clear that Saskatchewan has the food, fuel, and fertilizer that the world needs. Our province continues to prove it has incredible economic potential," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "We are attracting investment and growing our export markets to maintain our strong economy and ensure growth that works for everyone."

SASKATCHEWAN CELEBRATES NATIONAL NURSING WEEK, MAY 8-14



Province's Health Human Resources Action Plan Continues to Invest in Building a Stronger Healthcare Workforce

On National Nursing Week, the Government of Saskatchewan recognizes the unwavering dedication and commitment of nearly 18,000 nurses working across the province on the front lines of health care.

The theme this year for National Nursing Week is *Our Nurses. Our Future*. Building capacity within the health care system and strengthening the current and future health care workforce are top priorities for the Government of Saskatchewan. Saskatchewan's Health Human Resources (HHR) Action Plan continues to see positive results, including for nurses.

In 2022, the number of nurses of all designations practicing in Saskatchewan increased by nearly 600 year-over-year. Since 2007, the number of nurses practicing in the province has increased by more than 5,300, including over 3,700 more Registered Nurses. The number of Nurse Practitioners has more than tripled to 343 and the number of licensed practical nurses has increased by more than 58 per cent to over 4,000.

It was a historic celebration and proud moments for Saskatchewan to see the Royal Canadian Mounted Police participating.

A parade was held to honour the King outside the Legislative Building last Friday.



The World-Spectator - Sergeant Major Scott Williamson, who grew up at Rocanville, led the RCMP contingent at the Coronation of King Charles Saturday. Williamson led four other RCMP riders, leading the way in front of the carriage carrying King Charles and the Royal Family. "For a farmboy from Saskatchewan, to be doing things like this, they're kind of pinch-me moments," Williamson said. In addition to Williamson, two young women — one a long-standing RCMP officer, the other a younger officer from Nova Scotia — as well as a man from Qalipu First Nation in Newfoundland and a man from Quebec were among those selected to ride for the RCMP in the coronation parade. Williamson called them "incredibly well-deserving members and members that will reflect very positively on Canada."

Williamson met Queen Elizabeth II on more than one occasion and participated in her funeral ceremonies. He called those "similar heart-pounding-through-chest moments."
