EARLY YEARS FAMILY RESOURCE CENTRE OPENS IN SASKATOON WILLOWGROVE



As MLA for Saskatoon Willowgrove, it was my great pleasure to attend and bring greetings on behalf of the Government of Saskatchewan at the Early Years Family Resource Centre in the Saskatoon Willowgrove constituency.

I was thrilled to be here among the families and staff of this Early Years Family Resource Centre who have worked so hard to make this opening a reality.

Ten years ago, our government oversaw the initial pilot of Early Years Family Resource Centres in Regina, Yorkton, and Sandy Bay.

It was envisioned that these centres would provide parents with young children a single access point in their community - one location where they can go to receive support, early childhood programming services, and information they need to assist them in raising and educating their children.

With the success of these initial facilities, our government has allocated additional funding and worked in collaboration with various levels of government and local communities to expand Family Resource Centres right across the province.

We have come so far in 10 years. Saskatchewan families with young children now have access to 21 centres in 19 communities throughout the province – and that is something worth celebrating!

We also continue to see the incredible work being done with families at the Saskatoon Early Years Family Resource Centre – West. When this facility opened, we soon realized a second location within Saskatoon was needed to meet the needs of families and children.

In 2024-25, operational funding of \$436,865 is being allocated to support this Early Years Centre and is through the *Canada-Saskatchewan Bilateral Early Learning and Child Care Agreement*. By continuing to invest in Early Years Family Resource Centres, we are showing our commitment to supporting parents during their children's crucial early years of development and growth.

By providing free early learning programming and literacy opportunities, parents support, and easy access to reliable information – we know this will have a lasting impact for families and children well into their future.

From March 18th to March 31st, this new location has already welcomed over 200 adults and children and 42 visiting professionals for tours of the centre. These are incredible figures and the Centre should be so proud!

I cannot wait to see how many more families will visit this centre and receive the supports they may need.

The work done at this Early Years Family Resource Centre and all the Saskatchewan Early Years Family Resource Centres are making immeasurable impacts on families and our great province, which I am truly grateful for.

Again, it was a pleasure to celebrate this exciting grand opening..

The Swoop® Portable MR Imaging System is able to complete brain scans at the bedside of some pediatric patients within minutes and allow family to be present, providing comfort and convenience to Saskatchewan's youngest patients.

Health Minister Everett Hindley today joined representatives from the Saskatchewan Health Authority, Jim Pattison Children's Hospital Foundation, Indigenous leaders and major donors to celebrate the launch.

SASKATOON MAYOR DELIVERS STATE OF THE CITY ADDRESS

Mayor Charlie Clark struck an upbeat tone about the future of Saskatoon during his annual state of the city speech Tuesday at a Chamber of Commerce event at TCU Place, while acknowledging some fairly large challenges looming in the present.

"Our importance to the world is stronger than it's ever been," Clark said, referencing the opportunities available in a growing Saskatoon and contrasting this to decades past, when many people left to seek opportunities elsewhere.

He said the city has continued streamlining and modernizing services, while maintaining a triple-

A credit rating and keeping property taxes at rates that compare favourably to other Canadian cities.

While he largely stuck to a positive vision of the city's future, he also discussed tough choices ahead for the city's finances, the push to revitalize the downtown core and the impact of rising homelessness, mental health and addictions issues.

Clark emphasized that planning for a new arena and convention centre needs to happen now, before the current facilities at TCU Place and SaskTel Centre fully exhaust their useful lives. He noted that delaying planning for replacements until then would impose extra costs.

Moody's Investors Services affirmed Saskatchewan's credit rating at Aa1 with a stable outlook.

"This announcement from Moody's is confirmation of the strength of the Saskatchewan economy and affirms the decisions that were made in the recent provincial budget," Deputy Premier and Minister of Finance Donna Harpauer said. "While the volatile world economy provides challenges, Saskatchewan continues to maintain one of the lowest net debt-to-GDP ratios in the country. It also supports our decision to pay down government operating debt by \$2.5 billion over the last two fiscal years."

In their release, Moody's states, "The province's fiscal outlook and treasury management are very strong. The stable outlook reflects Saskatchewan's capacity to preserve long-term fiscal health."

Saskatchewan currently has the second-highest credit rating among the provinces when all three major rating agencies are considered. The province's GDP reached an all-time high of \$77.9 billion in 2023, and increased 1.6 per cent.

Ratings by firms such as Moody's Investors Services, a major credit rating agency in the international financial community, influence the cost that a government pays on borrowed money.

PROVINCE INVESTS \$51.2 MILLION IN NEW HEALTH CARE TRAINING OPPORTUNITIES



The Government of Saskatchewan is making progress on its ambitious health training seat expansion. In 2024-25, a \$51.2 million investment will support new and ongoing expansion of health care training across the province with an emphasis on nursing seats.

Over the past three years government has invested over \$111.5 million to expand health training programs in support of the Health Human Resources Action Plan. Approximately 870 new health care training seats - over 250 in nursing programs - are being implemented for Saskatchewan students.

"Our government recognizes the importance of training the next generation of health care professionals to serve the needs of people across Saskatchewan," Premier Scott Moe said.

"Expanding education opportunities is a key deliverable of our Health Human Resources Action Plan. This investment in training is a part of broader efforts to meet the current and future need for nurses and other health care professionals in our province."



SPRING SEEDING UNDERWAY FOR SASKATCHEWAN



Spring seeding by Saskatchewan producers is officially underway across the province, with 12 per cent of the 2024 crop now planted.

"Saskatchewan farmers are back in the field doing what they do best and in many ways better than anyone in the world," Agriculture Minister David Marit said. "Our producers have generated record agri-food exports for each of the past four years, growing crops with some of world's smallest carbon footprints compared to other competitive jurisdictions. While seeding is underway, I encourage everyone to stay safe and especially to be aware of farm equipment on the province's roads during this very busy time of year."

Widespread rainfall was welcomed this week by producers throughout the province. The provincial seeding progress of 12 per cent is behind the five-year average (2019-2023) of 23 per cent and the 10-year average (2014-2023) of 20 per cent. Seeding is furthest advanced in the southwest and southeast parts of the province. Seeding progress has been slower in the east-

central and northeast regions where spring snowfall accumulations were higher.

INCOME ASSISTANCE MOBILE OUTREACH SERVICES INITIATIVE EXPANDING



The Government of Saskatchewan is investing \$690,000 in the 2024-25 provincial budget to expand the Income Assistance Mobile Outreach Services initiative. An additional 10 Ministry of

Social Services employees will be placed within select community-based organizations to support clients with complex challenges where they are.

"This investment will significantly build on this important initiative that currently places income assistance workers on-site at 26 community-based organization locations across Saskatchewan," Social Services Minister Gene Makowsky said. "This approach is already making a positive impact to reduce service gaps and barriers for clients, better engage with community-based organizations in joint case planning and accelerating the path to stability for clients with high needs."

Mobile income assistance workers take in-person applications for new clients, assist with obtaining necessary documentation, complete service level screenings, provide appropriate referrals to other programs and agencies and assist with finding secure stabilized housing.

YOUR LEGISLATIVE REPORT



As Saskatchewan's population and economy continue to grow, our government remains committed to investing in our growing workforce. The 2024-25 provincial budget invests in growing Saskatchewan's workforce through the advanced education sector, workforce training programs and enhanced credential recognition.

Investing in Saskatchewan's present and future at the post-secondary education level is a priority for our government. The budget provides \$793 million for the Ministry of Advanced Education – an increase of \$28.2 million, or 3.7 per cent, from last year – to enhance funding, expand health training programs and focus on key infrastructure projects.

This includes a one-time, \$12 million top-up to the province's current multi-year funding agreement with post-secondary institutions, an increase of 2.2 per cent. The increased funding will allow the institutions to remain responsive to the needs of students and the labour market.

The budget also provides nearly \$15 million in new funding to train additional health care workers through the Health Human Resources Action Plan. This includes an operating increase of \$11.4

million for new seats across several programs.

Through the Health Human Resources Action Plan, over 610 new seats will be added to training programs for various professions, with a focus on high-demand and hard-to-recruit professions, such as registered nurses, licensed practical nurses, primary care paramedics and continuing care assistants. A total of 600 new seats will be added in nursing programs, including registered nursing, nurse practitioner and registered psychiatric nursing programs. In addition, 32 seats will be added to the undergraduate medical education program.

Our government is also investing \$3.6 million this year in new opportunities for students to train in health sciences programs in the province. These include physician assistant, speech language pathology, occupational therapy and respiratory therapy.

Saskatchewan post-secondary institutions receive nearly \$725 million in operating and capital grants in this year's budget. This includes funding to help the Western College of Veterinary Medicine explore an infrastructure expansion. Meanwhile, Indigenous Teacher Education programs will continue to receive funding, supporting the preservation and revitalization of Indigenous languages in the province.

To assist students pursuing post-secondary education, the budget includes \$4.2 million in new funding to create a new provincial grant for low-income students with dependents under 12, or over 12 with a permanent disability. This new grant is part of \$46.5 million for overall student supports in the budget, which includes \$34.4 million for the Student Aid Fund (repayable and non-repayable financial assistance to more than 22,000 students each year) and \$12.2 million for scholarships and bursaries.

To help post-secondary students remain in Saskatchewan as they transition to their careers, the budget continues to fund the Graduate Retention Program – the most generous support program of its kind in Canada. The program provides up to \$20,000 in tax credits to post-secondary graduates who remain in the province to work. More than 81,600 students have benefited from the program, which provides \$65 million in support annually.

To help meet current and future labour market needs in our growing province, the Ministry of Immigration and Career Training receives \$160.5 million in the budget. This includes continued support for skills training programs and services for unemployed or underemployed persons. These include adult essential skills training, pre-employment programs and services, credentialled skills training programs delivered through post-secondary institutions, and employment for persons with disabilities.

The budget includes an increase of \$1.5 million for the Saskatchewan Apprenticeship Trade Certification Commission to add 250 additional seats for construction-related trades, including electrician, plumbing and welding. This increases the investment in apprenticeship training to \$22.9 million and expands the number of training seats to 4,700.

To support the Health Human Resources Action Plan, our government will invest in training and settlement supports for in-demand health professions. This includes training seats for continuing care aides, licensed practical nurses and medical lab assistants.

The Ministry's budget also includes \$856,000 to support record nominations through the Saskatchewan Immigrant Nominee Program, which will help address the labour needs of Saskatchewan employers. Safeguards are being added to the program to enhance fraud detection and protect its integrity.

Additionally, the Labour Mobility and Fair Registration Practices Office will continue to help individuals with foreign credentials or those who are licensed in other provinces navigate the licensure process with their respective regulators. This is another effort to ensure we have a skilled workforce and trained professionals in place to support our growing economy.



The Province Added 12,300 Jobs Year-Over-Year, with the Fourth Lowest Unemployment Rate Among the Provinces



Statistics Canada released Saskatchewan's building permit figures, which show a 15.8 per cent increase year-over-year growth for March 2024, compared to March 2023 (seasonally adjusted). This places Saskatchewan well-above the national decrease of negative 15.2 per cent.

These work zones can also have temporary speed reductions, even when workers are not present. Speed reductions protect drivers and vehicles from potential work zone hazards such as a sharp pavement drop-off, lane closure and/or loose gravel.

TICK SEASON - TAKE PRECAUTIONS



Tick season is here. As temperatures climb, remember to take precautions to reduce exposure to tick bites and the risk of tick-borne illnesses when enjoying the outdoors.

To prevent tick bites:

- Wear light-coloured clothes so ticks can be easily seen.
- Wear pants, long-sleeved shirts and shoes that do not expose your bare feet.
- Pull socks over your pant legs to prevent ticks from crawling up your legs.
- Use insect repellents that contain DEET or lcaridin. Apply repellent to clothes as well as your skin. Always read and follow the directions on the label. Some repellents may have age restrictions.
- Shower or bathe as soon as possible after being outside to wash off loose ticks and inspect for attached ticks.

People can submit photographs of ticks found on humans or animals using the eTick online system at www.etick.ca to receive timely identification of the type of tick that attached to a person, pet, or livestock animal.


The Government of Saskatchewan is recognizing May 13-17, 2024 as Innovation Week in Saskatchewan.






