

GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN DECLARES WILDFIRE STATE OF EMERGENCY



Government of Saskatchewan Declares Wildfire State of Emergency | News and Media | Government of Saskatchewan

Due to the wildfires affecting communities across Saskatchewan, today Premier Scott Moe, in conjunction with the Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA), declared a provincial State of Emergency.

As of this morning, there are 17 active wildfires in Saskatchewan and 15 communities have evacuated. To date this year, there have been 206 wildfires, well above the five-year average of 125.

This declaration provides enhanced powers to the Minister and SPSA that may be required to help address this unprecedented start of the fire season. The province does not take the exercise of these powers lightly, but they are necessary to enhance public safety. The state of emergency will be in effect for 30 days and can be extended if necessary.

The SPSA has committed to providing daily updates on the current wildfire situation

to ensure that Saskatchewan residents are provided with the most up to date information.




SPSA FIRE BAN REVISED TO PREVENT FURTHER HUMAN CAUSED WILDFIRES



The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) has expanded the provincial fire ban to include:

- All vacant Crown land;
- Provincial parks located within the provincial forest; and,
- The provincial forest, including the Northern Saskatchewan Administrative District.

The SPSA is actively working to protect the Candle Lake area by installing fire guards north of Minowukaw. These fire guards will connect Candle Lake to the Torch area and involve widening Highway 120 to improve access and enhance safety for everyone.

On the west side of Candle Lake, the SPSA is also constructing a fire guard south of Hannin Creek through a cut block, linking the lake with the main road.

These efforts are focused on safeguarding our loved ones, lands and our homes. Thank you for staying informed and supporting our dedicated fire crews as they work tirelessly to keep our community safe."

SASKATCHEWAN PUBLIC SAFETY AGENCY CLOSELY MONITORING THE WILDFIRE SITUATION



Minister Eric Schmalz, "The Saskatchewan Public Safety Agency (SPSA) is closely monitoring the wildfire situation near Candle Lake and is working in coordination with local community leadership to support response efforts. SPSA has deployed resources in the area, including ground crews and air support, and will continue to provide assistance as needed to protect impacted communities. The SPSA has been working closely with Candle Lake leadership to implement the construction of a fire guard. Equipment is currently on the ground and is at work to construct the fire guard. If you are travelling in the area, please watch for crews and equipment. I would also like to thank the frontline crews and local leaders working tirelessly to protect our community. Please continue to stay informed through official channels and take precautions to stay safe. Anyone who spots a wildfire can call 1-800-667-9660, dial 9-1-1 or contact their closest SPSA Forest Protection Area Office. 

NATIONAL ACCESSABILITY WEEK







WEEKLY CROP REPORT



Producers made significant progress again this week, with seeding now 88 per cent complete in Saskatchewan. This is ahead of the five-year average of 82 per cent and the 10-year average of 85 per cent. Topsoil moisture is showing some slight decline due to warm windy conditions.

The southwest is the furthest advanced in seeding progress at 95 per cent complete. This is followed closely by the west-central region at 94 per cent, the northwest region at 93 per cent and the northeast region at 92 per cent. The east-central and southeast regions are the furthest behind at 81 per cent and 80 per cent respectively.
