

UNIVERSITY OF REGINA ALUMNI & SPORTS HALL OF FAME AWARDS





- The child who is grabbing more than one piece of candy, might have poor fine motor skills.
- The child who does not say "Trick or Treat" or "Thank You" might be nonverbal.
- The child who looks disappointed when they see your bowl might have an allergy.
 - The child who isn't wearing a costume, might have Sensory Processing Disorder or Autism.
 - The person who looks too old to be trick or treating, might be developmentally delayed.

Have a safe and happy Halloween. Please take extra care driving and watch for the excited children in our communities. Slow down and watch for pedestrians. Parents, make sure your trick-or-treaters don't venture onto the roadway and put themselves at risk.

Halloween is an exciting day for children. The following is the safety tips provided by RCMP:

Parents and Guardians:

 Know who your children are going trick-or-treating with and when they plan to return home

- Remind children to stay in their neighbourhood
- Remind children of which houses they can go to for safety if they get scared
- Remind children to respect others' property by staying off of lawns and gardens and avoiding houses with the lights off

Children and Teens:

- Do not go trick-or-treating alone; go with a trusted adult or a group
- Let your parents know where you are going and for how long
- Stay in your neighbourhood and know where trusted people live so you can go there if you get scared
- Do not visit houses with the lights off
- Cross the street at marked crosswalks and intersections
- Wait for an adult to inspect your candy before eating it
- Only eat things that are in unopened wrappers
- When you get home, keep your treats in a safe spot, away from small children and pets.



Motorists:

• Drive slowly, especially in residential areas

- Approach intersections with extreme caution
- Limit distractions in your vehicle in case you need to react quickly
- If possible, avoid driving through subdivisions and areas full of trick-ortreaters

Costume Tips:

- Wear light coloured or bright costumes, reflective tape and arm bands to increase visibility
- Wear properly fitted costumes and appropriate footwear to reduce your chance of slipping and falling
- Vision can be obstructed by masks. Wear makeup instead or make sure the mask has big enough eye openings to see clearly
- Dress for the weather conditions. Wear layers underneath your costume if temperatures are cold.

SASKATCHEWAN POST-SECONDARY STUDENTS BENEFIT FROM INCREASED MITACS INTERNSHIPS



Saskatchewan students now have more opportunities to access research internships. In 2025-26, Saskatchewan is providing \$1.58 million to support Mitacs - an increase of \$430,000 from last year.

The funding will support up to 301 research and development internships for students and post-doctoral fellows.



"Our government is proud to work with Mitacs to expand student access to high-quality research opportunities in the province," Advanced Education Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "This investment increases the number of internships available and strengthens ties with Saskatchewan businesses through key programs such as the Indigenous Pathways Initiative."

SASKATCHEWAN FUNDS GROWING RESEARCH AND INNOVATION PARTNERSHIP



The Government of Saskatchewan is strengthening the foundation of a unique research partnership that will support energy and mineral research and help make Saskatchewan a global leader in clean energy. To date, the province has committed \$780,000 to help establish and support the operations of the Global Institute for Energy, Minerals and Society (GIEMS).

GIEMS is a research and training partnership between Saskatchewan Polytechnic, the University of Regina and the University of Saskatchewan that began to create a

collaborative pipeline of innovation and talent. As a result of Saskatchewan's ongoing international engagement efforts, a memorandum of understanding establishing the collaboration was first announced at COP28 in Dubai in 2023. The partnership aims to promote and align research and innovation in the province's energy and mineral sectors.

"GIEMS is already opening up new opportunities to accelerate research and innovation and train future leaders in these critical sectors," Advanced Education Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "This partnership will support our labour market and significantly advance Saskatchewan's Growth Plan goals. It will help position Saskatchewan to be at the forefront of clean energy."


Advancing Primary Care

- Physician Innovation Fund -

Since launching last year, the \$10 million annual fund has supported:

- 28 approved projects across Saskatchewan
- 56+ new full-time positions for health care professionals
- Ongoing support for training, collaboration, and infrastructure improvements

In August 2024, the Government of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Medical Association (SMA) launched a \$10 million annual Physician Innovation Fund to support family physician-led, team-based health care clinics in communities across the province.



This agreement invests in innovative ideas from physicians themselves to improve patient access to high-quality, team-based primary care and strengthen collaboration between successful Innovation Fund recipients and resources within Saskatchewan's public health care system.

"This funding represents a major step forward in building stronger, team-based care models that improve patient outcomes and support physicians in their practices," Health Minister Jeremy Cockrill said. "Physicians are empowered to explore innovative ideas, enhance patient care through team-based approaches, and support their professional growth."

The provincial government has designated October 26th to November 1st, 2025, as Health Care Provider Week in Saskatchewan.






