

<u>McORMOND DRIVE & COLLEGE DRIVE INTERCHANGE -</u> <u>MEETING TOMORROW, TUESDAY, APRIL 11th!</u>



Two years ago City Council received a report outlining the 10 year priorities for major improvements on the City of Saskatoon's transportation network. One of the projects on that list was an interchange at the intersection of McOrmond Drive and College Drive. That same year, the functional plan for this interchange was presented to the community at an open house. Feedback at the time focused on the desire to speed up the timeframe for construction of the interchange to retain a free flow movement of traffic.

Construction of the McOrmond Drive and College Drive interchange will begin in April 2017, helping improve access and ease congestion in southeast portions of the city. Prior to work affecting traffic, the City is hosting an Information Session for residents and businesses in the vicinity of McOrmond Drive and College Drive:

> Tuesday, April 11, 2017 6 p.m. to 8:30 p.m. St. Joseph High School 115 Nelson Road

In addition to the McOrmond Drive and College Drive interchange, a second interchange at Boychuk Drive and Highway 16 will be built simultaneously to reduce costs. These savings are estimated to be a minimum of \$1 million based on reduced procurement costs, due to only a single procurement, and economies of scale for design and construction of the project. Together, the simultaneous construction of the two interchanges is known as the Saskatoon Interchange Project.

Throughout the construction of this interchange, communications will be key. Information regarding the interchanges will be made available here, at saskatoon.ca/interchanges. As the project progresses, more specific information will be shared with the community here, through public service announcements and through community associations. Residents can also subscribe to receive regular project updates via email.

PREMIER CONCLUDES SUCCESSFUL WASHINGTON MEETINGS



Wall Made Case for Free Trade with New Administration and U.S. Legislators

Premier Brad Wall concluded his trade mission to Washington, D.C. where he promoted the continuation of a strong trade relationship and free trade between Canada and the U.S. as a benefit to both countries.

"Saskatchewan is an exporting province, so it's important to be down here making the case for free trade, especially at a time that the new administration is looking at re-opening NAFTA," Wall said. "Thousands of jobs in both countries are dependent on trade between our two countries, and those jobs are threatened by any new trade barriers."

Wall said everyone he met with understood the importance of the Canada-U.S. trade relationship.

"While it probably makes sense to update NAFTA, which is now nearly 25 years old, I am confident that everyone wants to do so in a way that protects the unique trade relationship between our two countries and the jobs it creates," Wall said. "That said, Canada cannot be complacent about the future of our trade relationship with the U.S., and Canadian officials at both the provincial and federal levels need to be continuously engaging with U.S. leaders on this and other important issues."

VETERANS OF THE BATTLE OF VIMY RIDGE HONOURED



The Battle of Vimy Ridge Commemorating 100 Years

I was pleased to be among a crowd of over two hundred people that gathered to attend the service commemorating the Battle of Vimy Ridge at Kiwanis Park in Saskatoon. Also in attendance were colleagues; the Honourable Don Morgan, MLA David Buckingham, MLA Eric Olauson, MLA David Forbes. Other dignitaries in attendance included MP's Kelly Block and Kevin Waugh, along with Mayor Charlie Clark.

People around the country remembered the thousands of Canadians who gave their lives as we commemorated the 100th anniversary of the Battle of Vimy Ridge. We pay tribute and thank every Canadian who has served our country.

This weekend we were proud to recognize the sacrifice that our Canadian and Saskatchewan veterans made 100 years ago in the capturing of Vimy Ridge.

Their valour not only contributed to the eventual Allied victory in the First World War, but marked Canada's coming of age as a nation. The sacrifice of those that lost their lives at the Battle of Vimy Ridge during the First World War was commemorated on the 100th anniversary of the battle, during special events on April 9 and again on April 12 in Regina. The Battle of Vimy Ridge took place in the Nord-Pas-de-Calais region of France on April 9 through 12 in 1917, between the Canadian Corps and heavily-entrenched German troops. More than 400 Saskatchewan soldiers were among the nearly 4,000 Canadians who perished in the fight.

"The Battle of Vimy Ridge has become known as a defining moment in Canada's rise as a nation in the world community," Provincial Military Liaison and Moose Jaw Wakamow MLA Greg Lawrence said. "It's a privilege to honour those whose sacrifice left such a lasting legacy for all Canadians. It's especially fitting that we pay tribute during Canada's 150th anniversary celebrations to those who gave so much to preserve our freedom."

TOW TRUCK LIGHTING CHANGES COMING TO INCREASE VISIBILITY AND SAFETY AT ROADSIDE



Regulations to be Amended This Spring

Government today introduced and passed legislation improving safety for tow truck operators. The Traffic Safety (Tow Trucks) Amendment Act, 2017 permits blue lights to be used in conjunction with amber lights on tow trucks.

The legislation was introduced and passed in one day, which is a rare occurrence and requires the unanimous support of the Legislature. The move comes after tow truck operator Courtney Schaefer was killed March 7, 2017, in a collision along the roadside near the Gerald area during blizzard conditions.

"We've heard from tow truck operators about how they risk their lives daily while they assist motorists in distress," Minister Responsible for Saskatchewan Government Insurance (SGI) Joe Hargrave said. "Adding blue lights will increase visibility, heighten awareness as well as increase safety for all operators and the public."

NEW INTERNAL TRADE AGREEMENT WILL BENEFIT SASKATCHEWAN BUSINESSES AND WORKERS



The new Canadian Free Trade Agreement (CFTA) will level the playing field for Saskatchewan businesses and workers as they pursue opportunities across the country, according to Saskatchewan's Minister responsible for Trade.

Jeremy Harrison was in Toronto last Friday with other federal, provincial and territorial trade ministers for the announcement of the agreement, which will greatly reduce barriers to trade, investment and worker mobility when it takes effect on July 1 of this year.

"Saskatchewan has long championed a Canadian market that is open and transparent and which allows our businesses to compete fairly and freely across the country," Harrison said. "The negotiations on this agreement were complicated and at times challenging, spanning two and one-half years and 21 separate sessions, but the goodwill and collaboration of the parties involved has resulted in an agreement of which all our governments can be proud."

PROVINCE STRENGTHENS SUPPORT FOR VICTIMS OF CRIME AND VIOLENCE

Government today introduced and passed legislation to support individuals fleeing interpersonal violence and families of victims of crime.

The Victims of Interpersonal Violence Act and The Residential Tenancies Act, 2006 will be amended to allow a tenant to end a fixed-term rental agreement with 28 days' notice if they or their family members are being abused by another resident or former resident.

"These amendments will provide a way out for someone living in a violent domestic situation," Justice Minister and Attorney General Gordon Wyant said. "The fact that an individual has signed, for example, a year-long lease will no longer factor into their decision to leave."

OIL DRILLING NUMBERS DOUBLE IN FIRST QUARTER

Saskatchewan's petroleum industry is showing signs of a positive start for 2017 after results for drilling activity during the first three months of the year were more than double the figures of

2016.

"An increase of more than 450 wells drilled is an optimistic indicator for our oil industry and, by extension, Saskatchewan's economic outlook for the year ahead," Energy and Resources Minister Dustin Duncan said.

BUILDING PERMITS RISE

Non-residential building permits in Saskatchewan increased by 138.0 per cent (seasonally adjusted) between January and February 2017, well ahead of the 4.5 per cent decline recorded nationally. Saskatchewan had the second highest percentage increase among the provinces.

"The rise in non-residential building permits demonstrates the continued strength and resilience of the Saskatchewan economy," Economy Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "When compared to the rest of the country, Saskatchewan's building permit growth is well above what other provinces are experiencing."
