Saskatchewan continues to have the lowest unemployment rate in Canada for the 15th consecutive month. At 4.5 per cent (seasonally adjusted), the Saskatchewan rate was well below the national average of 6.9 per cent.

The Labour Force Survey released today by Statistics Canada also shows that the youth unemployment rate of 9.6 per cent (seasonally adjusted) is the lowest in the country and below the national rate of 13.6 per cent.

"Saskatchewan's labour market remains strong, our unemployment rate remains low and we have plenty of hard working men and women taking advantage of the incredible opportunities," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Kevin Doherty said on behalf of Economy Minister Bill Boyd. "Today's numbers are further proof that our economy remains strong."

# GOVERNMENT OF SASKATCHEWAN INVESTS IN CARBON CAPTURE AND STORAGE RESEARCH

The Ministry of the Economy announced on April 2, a new funding agreement with the Petroleum Technology Research Centre (PTRC) to support the Saskatchewan CO2 Oilfield Use for Storage and EOR Research Project that will continue Saskatchewan's world-leading research on the geological storage of carbon dioxide.

The \$400,000 investment will augment additional funding from the United States Department of Energy, which has recognized Saskatchewan as a world leader in carbon storage research. This funding will address important technical issues associated with carbon dioxide storage, including well bore integrity, predicting carbon dioxide migration underground, and identification of effective monitoring techniques. It will also allow the PTRC to continue their mandate to conduct carbon dioxide enhanced oil recovery research designed to increase oil production in Saskatchewan.

# GOVERNMENT RAISES AUTISM AWARENESS FLAG FOR WORLD AUTISM AWARENESS DAY

The Government of Saskatchewan raised the autism awareness flag at the Legislative Building to recognize World Autism Awareness Day on April 2, and affirm its commitment to improving targeted autism services and supports in the province. Autism Spectrum Disorder (ASD) is a neurological disorder that affects how a person interacts with people, experiences the environment and processes information.

"World Autism Awareness Day is a valuable opportunity to learn more about Autism Spectrum Disorder, and to build a better understanding of this complex condition that has an impact on many Saskatchewan families," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "We're continuing to work with regional health authorities, community-based agencies and other organizations to build comprehensive service systems for individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder."

#### NOTIFYNOW: NEW MASS NOTIFICATION SYSTEM



The City of Saskatoon Emergency Measures Organization (EMO) on March 31 launched NotifyNOW, a new mass notification system. It means Saskatoon residents can receive information via direct text, voicemail, and e-mail messages in emergency situations that could

affect them or their property.

"NotifyNOW will provide the EMO with the capacity to reach tens of thousands of residents within seconds of an emergency occurring in Saskatoon," says Mayor Donald Atchison. "Public safety and security are a fundamental priority. This move is in line with City Council's strategic goals of Continuous Improvement and Quality of Life, making Saskatoon a great place to live."

An emergency could include any situation in which residents would be required to take some form of precautionary action as a result of a major blizzard, tornado warning, plane crash, hazardous goods spill, etc.

#### **MINIMUM WAGE TO INCREASE OCTOBER 1, 2014**

The Government of Saskatchewan will increase the province's minimum wage from \$10 to \$10.20 per hour effective October 1, 2014 and will soon introduce regulations to provide for regular indexing of the minimum wage each year.

"Increasing the minimum wage will give minimum wage earners more disposable income and improve their standard of living," Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister Don Morgan said. "Indexation of the minimum wage will provide security for minimum wage earners and ensure predictability for business owners in the province. Since 2007, we have increased the minimum wage in Saskatchewan six times and have gone from \$7.95 to \$10.20. That's 28 per cent, which is well ahead of the rate of inflation."

**WORLD PARKINSON'S DAY - APRIL 11** 



World Parkinson's Day is observed every year on April 11, marking the birthday of Dr. James Parkinson. Researchers in Canada and around the world are continuing to broaden the understanding of Parkinson's as a progressive brain disease that has mood and cognitive symptoms.

Parkinson's is a progressive brain disease for which there is no cure. Over 100,000 Canadians and over 6 million people worldwide have Parkinson's. The story of the Parkinson Tulip began in 1980 in the Netherlands when J.W.S. Van der Wereld, a Dutch horticulturalist who had Parkinson's disease, developed a red and white tulip.

# PROVINCE TO COMMEMORATE THE 100TH ANNIVERSARY OF THE START OF THE FIRST WORLD WAR

This summer, Saskatchewan will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the First World War during a military service of remembrance on the Legislative grounds in Regina. At that time, the names of 1,200 Saskatchewan citizens who lost their lives during that conflict will be added to the Saskatchewan First World War Memorial. These names were missed

when the memorial was dedicated in 1995.

When the Saskatchewan War Memorial Committee began researching the Saskatchewan casualties in 1988 for inclusion on the memorial, limited source material provided an incomplete record. Research that has been completed since for the Virtual War Memorial has resulted in the addition of 1,200 names.

"Lest We Forget is a cautionary invocation repeated over time for our soldiers lost in service," Minister responsible for the Provincial Capital Commission Kevin Doherty said. "A century ago, they left their jobs, farms and families to defend our freedom. With our actions this year, we will be heeding that promise by remembering their names and honouring their sacrifices."
