

**BACK TO SCHOOL 2017** 



It has been a beautiful Saskatchewan summer. I hope teachers & support staff enjoyed a well deserved break. I'm sure the students are eager to get back to school to see their friends and begin another new school year.

I've had the following article in a previous newsletter but felt this was a good time to share it again. Kids often have a tough time making the back-to-school transition. I hope you will find the following information helpful:

As with any new or potentially unsettling situation — like starting school for the first time or
entering a new grade or new school — allow kids time to adjust. Remind them that everyone
feels a little nervous about the first day of school and that it will all become an everyday routine
in no time.

- It's important to talk to kids about what worries them and offer reassurance: Are they afraid they won't make new friends or get along with their teachers? Is the thought of schoolwork stressing them out? Are they worried about the bully from last year?
- We all have a critical role to play in building and promoting respectful and kind behaviour in our schools and communities Acts of bullying, harassment, intimidation and violence have a profound effect on an individual's feeling of safety and self-worth. I encourage everyone to work together to prevent bullying in our schools, communities and online.
- To help ease back-to-school butterflies, try to transition kids into a consistent school-night routine a few weeks before school starts. Also make sure that they:
  - get enough sleep (establish a reasonable bedtime so that they'll be well-rested and ready to learn in the morning)
  - eat a healthy breakfast (they're more alert and do better in school if they eat a good breakfast every day)
  - use a wall calendar or personal planner to record when assignments are due, tests will be given, extracurricular practices and rehearsals will be held, etc.
  - have them organize and set out what they need the night before (homework and books should be put in their backpacks by the door and clothes should be laid out in their bedrooms)

# SASKATCHEWAN APPLAUDS TRADE RULING AGAINST ALBERT BEER MARK-UP

Acting Minister Responsible for Trade Dustin Duncan is calling a ruling against the Government of Alberta's system of beer mark-ups a big win for free trade within Canada.

A panel set up under the Agreement on Internal Trade confirmed the Alberta government's current rebate program for small Alberta brewers as well as the program it had in 2015 discriminated against brewers from other provinces and was contrary to that province's free trade obligations. The panel has given the Alberta government six months to change its policy. However, the Alberta government is appealing the decision. The appeal process could take up to seven months.

"Our government has been a champion of eliminating trade barriers between the provinces and Alberta's rebate program has been a de facto barrier," Duncan said. "By contrast, our province provides a

graduated mark-up rate for small breweries, regardless of origin, and does not discriminate between Saskatchewan and out-of-province breweries when applying its mark-up.

# SASKATCHEWAN HEALTH AUTHORITY BOARD MEMBER APPOINTED

Health Minister Jim Reiter is pleased to announce Dr. Preston Smith has been appointed as a member of the Saskatchewan Health Authority Board of Directors.

"Dr. Smith is highly respected as a medical educator and health care administrator with extensive experience in Saskatchewan and Nova Scotia," Reiter said. "His unique perspective is a valuable addition to the 10 member board as it helps guide the formation of the Saskatchewan Health Authority."

Dr. Smith serves as the Dean of the College of Medicine and Vice-Provost Health at the University of Saskatchewan.

The Saskatchewan Health Authority Board is currently acting in an advisory capacity to help guide the transition from 12 Regional Health Authorities (RHAs) to a single provincial health authority. During the transition period, the current RHA boards remain in place to govern RHA operations.

The date The Provincial Health Authority Act is proclaimed and the Saskatchewan Health Authority officially launches is still being determined, but is anticipated to occur in late fall 2017. On that date, the RHA boards will dissolve and be replaced by the permanent Saskatchewan Health Authority Board.

### BUDGET ON TRACK TO MEET FISCAL CHALLENGES

The 2017-18 Saskatchewan Budget remains on track at first quarter, with no change in the bottom-line forecast.

"The Saskatchewan economy is performing well so far, and for the first time in two years is projected to post positive growth," Finance Minister Kevin Doherty said. "We have more to accomplish, but at first quarter we are meeting our fiscal challenge by controlling spending and shifting away from over-reliance

on volatile resource revenue."

At first quarter, a deficit of \$684.7 million is forecast, unchanged from budget. Revenue at first quarter is forecast to increase \$42 million (0.3 per cent) from budget, while total expense is forecast to increase by about \$82 million (0.6 per cent).

As planned, part of the budget's \$300 million contingency—about \$40 million—is being used to offset expense pressures. A further \$125 million of the contingency is being used to offset compensation savings that, because of the time required for negotiations to continue, will not be achieved this fiscal year.

"The reason we built a contingency into this year's budget was to help address in-year pressures,"

Doherty said. "We still have work to do to control government's overall costs, including savings we are working hard to achieve in total compensation expense."

Most key indicators for Saskatchewan's economy have been positive so far in 2017, including:

- the third-highest growth among Canadian provinces in manufacturing sales;
- the third-highest growth in average weekly earnings;
- · the third-highest growth in population; and
- the second-highest growth in new motor-vehicle sales.

"Private sector forecasters have recognized strength in Saskatchewan's economic performance and have increased real GDP growth forecasts for 2017 from an average of 1.7 per cent at budget to 2.1 per cent," Doherty said. "At first quarter, our government remains on track with our fiscal plan to return Saskatchewan's budget to balance in three years, by 2019-20.

"We need to follow and achieve our plan to continue on our path of growth, and to provide the services, programs and infrastructure Saskatchewan people value and need - today and into the future."
