### ABOVE NORMAL SPRING RUNOFF EXPECTED FOR SASKATOON

As Minister Responsible for the Saskatchewan Water Security Agency, we released the February spring runoff forecast yesterday, February 13.

We are expecting above normal runoff for the Saskatoon, North Battleford and Prince Albert region. Although most of the province is looking at a near normal situation, the Saskatoon, North Battleford and Prince Albert's regions could once again be facing some significant challenges with the threat of high than normal water levels.

Overall, winter precipitation ranges from below average in the southeast to well above average in

the Prince Albert region. Fall precipitation in the 30 days prior to freeze-up was generally below normal with the exception of central Saskatchewan, which was above normal.

Spring flows depend on three factors:

- Moisture conditions from the fall;
- Snow accumulation from the winter; and
- The rate of melt in the spring along with the amount of rainfall during runoff.

In the Saskatoon area, we saw an above normal amount of precipitation in the fall and winter and many portions of the areas at risk have poor natural drainage patterns. This combined with high water levels carried over from previous consecutive years and well above normal runoff contributes to challenges that we could face this spring.

Water Security Agency will help the communities facing an above normal spring runoff. They are assessing the implications and will determine whether new programming or new measure are required, similar to programs in the past two years.

Hopefully the investments in mitigation works over the past two years will be helpful if flood conditions occur this year.

The Water Security Agency will issue its next forecast next month. The forecast is available on the Water Security Agency website (<u>wsask.ca</u>), which also offers a mobile site for easy access from a tablet or mobile device.

# SASKATOON HAD THE LOWEST UNEMPLOYMENT RATE AMONG MAJOR CITIES IN THE COUNTRY

Saskatchewan's unemployment rate remains the lowest in Canada for the thirteenth consecutive month. According to figures released by Statistics Canada last week, the province's rate currently sits at 4.3 per cent, and well below the national average of 7.0 per cent.

The province's youth unemployment was 7.5 per cent in January - also the lowest in the country. The national youth unemployment rate was 13.9 per cent.

"Last year we saw record-breaking job numbers, low unemployment rates and so much optimism on the jobs front in this province," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "Once again our province is proving that we have more people working in Saskatchewan than ever before and that the momentum from 2013 has clearly sustained itself."
