HEALTH REGIONS CONTINUE TO WORK TOWARD THREE-MONTH WAIT TIMES GOAL

More patients than ever are receiving surgical care in our province. Under the Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative, health regions are streamlining processes to reduce the waiting time for patients, while also managing increased demand.

"Almost four years ago, our government set the ambitious target of providing all elective surgeries within three months," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Since the introduction of this initiative, there has been a dramatic improvement in access to surgical care for the people of Saskatchewan."

SASKATOON YARD WASTE GREEN CART PROGRAM EXTENDED



Though Saskatoon is still in the depths of winter, there should be a glimmer of warm weather hope. The City of Saskatoon has decided to extend their Green Cart Program for 2014!

The Green Cart Program is a convenient and cost-effective way to dispose of your yard waste without sending it to the landfill. When organic waste, such as leaves and grass, ends up in the landfill, it uses up valuable air space and it produces methane gas when it decomposes, a

greenhouse gas much more potent than carbon dioxide. Instead, the yard waste collected through the Green Cart Program is converted into valuable compost that is used in City of Saskatoon parks, community and school gardens.

IT'S TAX TIME – ARE YOU ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN THE GRADUATE RETENTION PROGRAM (GRP)?

What is the Graduate Retention Program?

Saskatchewan is thriving and opportunities for graduates have never been brighter. The Graduate Retention Program rewards you for building your future in Saskatchewan by providing a refund up to \$20,000 of tuition fees paid by eligible graduates who live in Saskatchewan and who file a Saskatchewan income tax return.

The Graduate Retention Program became effective January 1, 2008.

SASKATOON AMONG CITIES EXPECTED TO LEAD ECONOMIC GROWTH THIS YEAR

Saskatoon and Regina are among the cities expected to lead the country in economic growth in 2014.

A Conference Board of Canada report released Wednesday indicated, after growing 6.5 per cent in 2013, Saskatoon's GDP's expected to rise 3.2 this year, as ongoing strength in the services sector is offset by slower activity in goods.
