PIKE LAKE PROVINCIAL PARK SWIMMING POOL UPGRADE AND CANADA DAY FESTIVITIES

It was wonderful to be there to announce some exciting upgrades for Pike Lake Provincial Park. Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Ken Cheveldayoff was at Pike Lake Provincial Park today to announce an investment of more than \$240,000 to upgrade the very popular Pike Lake swimming pool and waterslide. Completion of this work will address the current safety concerns and extend the useful life of the waterslide.

"Provincial parks are an important part of Saskatchewan's quality of life and are more popular than ever," Cheveldayoff said. "Projects like these help to ensure that everyone who visits our parks have a great experience."


The swimming pool and waterslide facility located at Pike Lake Provincial Park was constructed in 1986 and is a favourite attraction for park visitors. The facility consists of a swimming pool, waterslide, access-tower, and a service building. These upgrades will ensure the facility remains in good condition

and available for the public to enjoy for many years to come.

Repairs of the waterslide access-tower and supports will take place in the fall of 2017 and visitors are still welcome to enjoy its offerings this summer. A second phase of construction is planned for 2018-19 and will involve other repairs to finalize this project.

This summer, in celebration of Canada's 150th anniversary, Saskatchewan provincial parks will be offering free entry on Canada Day, July 1 and Canada's Parks Day, July 15. #### REPORT FROM THE LEGISLATURE



Saskatchewan residents who pay income tax will soon be paying less and Saskatchewan people with lower incomes will receive a boost in their tax credit amounts.

Starting July 1, 2017, Saskatchewan Personal Income Tax rates will drop by half a percentage point, supporting our government's growth agenda and improving Saskatchewan's tax competitiveness. Saskatchewan Personal Income Tax rates will drop by another half point on July 1, 2019. Combined, these two reductions will save a single Saskatchewan taxpayer, with no dependents and an annual income of \$50,000, about \$77 per year. This person's 2020 Saskatchewan Personal Income Tax will be \$308 lower than his or her 2016 Saskatchewan Personal Income Tax.

Similarly, a married couple with two children and an annual family income of \$100,000, will save about \$117 per year. This family's 2020 Saskatchewan Personal Income Tax will be \$468 lower than their 2016

Saskatchewan Personal Income Tax as a result of these tax reductions.

Saskatchewan Low-Income Tax Credit amounts are going up with the maximum basic adult, spouse and equivalent-to-spouse amounts increasing by \$100. Dependent child amounts are increasing by \$40 per child. This boosts the maximum annual family benefit by 41 per cent.

In support of our growth agenda, Saskatchewan's general Corporate Income Tax rate will be reduced from 12 per cent to 11 per cent in half-point increments, effective July 1, 2017 and July 1, 2019. At 11 per cent, Saskatchewan's general Corporate Income Tax rate will be tied with British Columbia for the lowest in Canada, and will be one percentage point lower than Alberta's rate.

Shifting tax away from income through lower personal and corporate income tax rates, and onto consumption through an expanded PST, encourages productivity and keeps our economy strong.

The Manufacturing and Processing Profits Tax Reduction is being maintained, meaning that Saskatchewan's effective Corporate Income Tax rate on eligible manufacturing and processing income can be as low as 9% — the lowest tax rate on manufacturing and processing in the country.

Saskatchewan is known for growing, making and mining what the world needs. And our manufacturing and resource sectors are contributing to strong wholesale trade growth. The sustained growth of Saskatchewan's wholesale trade – second best in the nation – is attracting investments and new opportunities and highlights continued confidence in the province's economy.

Blessed with an abundance of beauty and natural resources, Saskatchewan is a great province and is part of what makes Canada a great country.

Saskatchewan people are proud members of the Canadian family who enjoy the freedom, quality of life and opportunity to live a life of our choosing. As we celebrated Canada 150 with family and friends, it was great to reflect on how fortunate we are to call Canada and Saskatchewan home.

# SOCCER DAY IN SASKATCHEWAN - WORLD CLASS SOCCER TALENT COMING TO NEW MOSAIC STADIUM



Creative Saskatchewan recently announced its investment in the production of *SuperGrid*, a new feature film produced by Hugh Patterson. Patterson successfully applied to Creative Saskatchewan's Screen-Based Media Production Grant. Creative Saskatchewan's investment means cameras are rolling in Saskatchewan right now.

As *SuperGrid* films in Saskatchewan, it is expected to spend approximately one million dollars in Saskatchewan businesses and on salaries for Saskatchewan workers. In addition to investing in production, Creative Saskatchewan also supported *SuperGrid* at its earliest stage by sponsoring a seat in the National Screen Institute's Features-First Program, where Patterson developed the project. *SuperGrid* tells the story of a young smuggler who is forced to make a run on the road that took the life of his younger sister.



# NEW EXHIBIT AT ROYAL SASKATCHEWAN MUSEUM OPENED CANADA DAY



A brand new exhibit, 150 for 150, is opening July 1, 2017 at the Royal Saskatchewan Museum (RSM).

Museums like the RSM collect and study specimens to better understand the life around us and to preserve them for generations to come. 150 for 150 recognizes the 150th year of Confederation by displaying 150 items from the provincial natural history and fossil collections. With more than 54,000 fossils, and 185,000 plants, animals and fungi to choose from, curators selected 150 species for guests to see up close.

"The Royal Saskatchewan Museum staff have brought to life an exhibit that tells a Saskatchewan and Canadian story," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "Featuring specimens from the caribou to the Saskatoon berry to the tooth of a Tyrannosaurus rex, this exhibit will educate and inspire. 150 for 150 is sure to be a great experience for all visitors." ### **CUTTING TAXES TO SPUR ECONOMIC GROWTH**

Saskatchewan's tax competitiveness," Finance Minister Kevin Doherty said. "Shifting tax away from income through lower personal and corporate income tax rates, and onto consumption through an expanded Provincial Sales Tax (PST), encourages productivity and keeps our province's economy strong."

# STUDENTS CAN NOW APPLY FOR THE 2017-18 STUDENT LOAN YEAR

The 2017-18 student loan year is underway and students can now submit their applications for student financial assistance for academic programs beginning on or after August 1, 2017.

As part of Budget 2017, changes were made to the Canada-Saskatchewan Integrated Loan Program to better target assistance to students with the greatest financial need.

#### These include:

- Consolidating existing grants and bursaries into an up-front grant of up to \$1,000.
- Simplifying student loan contributions by setting a fixed-rate contribution between \$1,500-\$3,000.

These changes provide for predictable levels of funding for low-income students and makes financial assistance more transparent and understandable.

"Our government is committed to helping students access post-secondary education through a variety of support programs and services," Advanced Education Minister Bronwyn Eyre said. "The changes to the Saskatchewan Student Loan program are part of government's efforts to continue to improve publically-funded programs and will help ensure post-secondary education remains affordable for students."

CANADA 150 LEGACY MONUMENT COMING TO SASKATCHEWAN



Saskatchewan will become the permanent home of one of 13 unique works of art representing Canadian provinces and territories that have been created in celebration of Canada's 150th anniversary. The exhibit of larger-than-life artistic horticulture structures, covered in live plants and flowers, are part of a larger Canada 150 exhibition that opens July 1 at Jacques Cartier Park in Gatineau, Quebec.

The Saskatchewan-themed work of art is a depiction of a Royal Canadian Mounted Police (RCMP) Officer dressed in Red Serge, on a horse. The structures were designed to reflect the values, culture and arts associated with each Canadian province and territory.

"This art work is an ideal representation for Saskatchewan and a creative way to celebrate an important milestone in our country's history," Minister Responsible for the Provincial Capital Commission Christine Tell said. "The symbolic nature of the art illustrates the important role the RCMP has played in the growth and history of Canada and our province."
