## SASKATCHEWAN POPULATION GROWS TO MORE THAN 1.17 MILLION



Saskatchewan's population has reached another all-time high, topping 1.17 million for the first time.

According to new figures released today by Statistics Canada, Saskatchewan grew by 1,488 people in the first quarter of 2018, to 1,171,240 people as of April 1. That's an increase of 11,691 people in the past year, and 157,806 more people in the past decade.

"Saskatchewan's population has now grown in 48 consecutive quarters," Trade and Export

Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "That's the longest period of sustained growth since quarterly records were first published in 1971."

The population increase in the most recent quarter was driven by net international migration of 2,731 people and a natural increase (births minus deaths) of 1,283, offset by net interprovincial migration of -2,526.

"Today, more people than even before call Saskatchewan home," Harrison said. "That's a clear sign our province and our economy are on track."

The Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority (FCAA) wants to protect seniors from financial exploitation and fraud. "We know seniors are trusting, often have accumulated wealth, and tend

not to report crimes, which makes them a target for fraudsters or exploitive relatives who want to take advantage of them," FCAA Securities Division Director Dean Murrison said. "We want seniors to know the warning signs of financial abuse so they can recognize when someone is targeting them, as well as preventative steps they can take to protect themselves and their finances."

Too frequently people provide personal information such as credit card numbers, banking information or PINs to people they do not know and end up losing money to fraudsters or unethical relatives.


Here are some tips for seniors so they can protect themselves from exploitation and fraud:

QUILTS FOR THE HUMBOLDT BRONCOS HELPING STITCH THE COMMUNITY

What a great story by Lynn Giesbrecht, Regina Leader Post!

Like a giant patchwork quilt, communities across the globe came together to stitch a blanket of comfort over the Humboldt community.

Sometimes one by one and sometimes in scores, handmade pieces made their way from Australia, Brazil, Qatar, England, Scotland and all across Canada and the U.S., covering Humboldt in a tangible expression of love and support.

When Wendy Toye first put out a call for quilts for the Humboldt Broncos on social media, she had no idea it would spark a global project.

After a semi-trailer unit collided with the Humboldt Broncos bus on April 6, killing 16 of the 29 people on board, the small community in central Saskatchewan was left in shock.

### MANUFACTURING SHIPMENTS RISE IN APRIL



Saskatchewan's manufacturing shipments were up 16.2 per cent (seasonally adjusted) to \$1.53 billion in April 2018 when compared to April 2017. This represents the second highest percentage increase among the provinces. Nationally, sales were up 3.6 per cent over the same period.

"This significant increase in the year-over-year comparison shows the resiliency and diversity of our economy," Trade and Export Development Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Manufacturing is one of the key components of Saskatchewan's economy, creating jobs and investment across the province."

On a month-over-month basis, shipments were up 6.7 per cent between March 2018 and April 2018, the highest percentage increase among the provinces. On a national basis, manufacturing shipments dropped 1.3 per cent. Year-over-year increases (seasonally unadjusted) were reported for food manufacturing (up 23.5 per cent); wood products (up 20.8 per cent); fabricated metal manufacturing (up 16.3 per cent) and; machinery manufacturing (up 10.1 per cent).

## DO NOT DO BUSINESS WITH COPERSTONE AND COPERSTONE PARTNERS




The Financial and Consumer Affairs Authority of Saskatchewan (FCAA) has issued a Temporary Cease Trade Order against Coperstone Limited and Coperstone Partners Limited, which appear to be operating an unregistered online securities and derivatives trading platform.

"If a company or person appears to be in the business of selling securities or derivatives in Saskatchewan, they must be registered," FCAA Deputy Director of Enforcement Ed Rodonets said. "An investor should always check to see if these companies or people are registered at www.aretheyregistered.ca before they invest. If they are not, it may be a scam and investors should not send any information or money."

A Saskatchewan resident opened an account on <a href="www.coperstone.com">www.coperstone.com</a>, and also provided Coperstone with a copy of his driver's license and a credit card statement. The resident was then contacted by a representative of Coperstone who sold and advised him on securities or derivatives.

Coperstone Limited and Coperstone Partners Limited are not registered to trade in or advise on securities or derivatives in Saskatchewan. Anyone contacted by Coperstone should contact the FCAA Securities Division at 306-787-5936.



Premier Scott Moe, "Did you know that over the past 11 years, Quebec has received nearly \$100 BILLION in equalization payments while Saskatchewan has received zero?

Many Saskatchewan people believe the federal Equalization program is inherently unfair. In just the past 11 years, more than \$190 billion has been paid out in Equalization to various provinces, and Saskatchewan has received \$0.

Some say that we have received a significant share of Equalization over the history of the program because of all the years we were a "have not" province under the NDP. Actually, that's not true.

Since Equalization was first introduced in 1957, Saskatchewan has received less than 2% of the \$430 billion paid out over the past 62 years, and Quebec has received \$221 billion - over 50%. In the past 11 years, while Saskatchewan received \$0, Quebec received nearly \$100 billion, or 56%, of the \$177 billion paid out.

Something must change. Our government is considering changes to Equalization and will put forward our proposal soon."

### **CROP REPORT FOR THE PERIOD JUNE 5 TO 11, 2018**



Rain across most of the province has helped to alleviate dry topsoil moisture conditions. Areas in the southeast, which was one of the drier regions over the past couple of months, received large amounts that caused flooding. The moisture will help to replenish pasture and encourage hay growth.

Seeding operations are mostly complete, but there are a few fields being seeded for green feed and silage. Germination is patchy in some regions due to dry conditions, but the recent rain has helped.

MINISTRY PROVIDES FUNDING TO RCMP FOR PERMANENT CRIME REDUCTION TEAMS

The Ministry of Corrections and Policing is providing roughly \$1.6 million to the RCMP to permanently expand the Crime Reduction Team (CRT) initiative in Saskatchewan.

This funding will be used for 14 full-time team members made up of 10 police officers and four support staff. Funding for these positions is provided through the Provincial Policing Services Agreement, which funds 70 per cent of all RCMP positions in Saskatchewan. These additional staff will comprise two permanent CRTs—one operating out of Prince Albert and one operating out of North Battleford—that will be established this fall. The RCMP will maintain a temporary CRT to ensure enforcement activities continue until the permanent teams are operational.

"The RCMP has seen great success with this project since they started the CRT as a pilot last February, and we're happy to support the establishment of these two permanent teams," Corrections and Policing Minister Christine Tell said. "We look forward to seeing the positive impact this program will have in Saskatchewan's rural communities." Continue reading this release <a href="here.">here.</a>

## SLOW DOWN THROUGH WORK ZONES SO THE THIRTEENTH MAN CAN GET HOME SAFELY




As another Saskatchewan Roughrider season kicks off and game day approaches, the thirteenth man is reminded to slow down through work zones. With construction work underway around

The occasion is observed on or near the summer solstice, a traditional time for generations of Indigenous peoples and communities to celebrate their culture.
