

RESPONSE TO THE 2014-15 BUDGET ADDRESS

SURGICAL WAIT TIMES CONTINUE TO DROP

Saskatchewan patients are receiving their surgeries sooner. Through the Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative, teams across the province are working to achieve the ambitious goal of offering all patients surgery within three months of the decision to proceed with an operation.

Updated statistics show that just over 80 per cent of patients receiving a surgery between November 1, 2013 and January 31, 2014, waited less than three months. Almost 93 per cent of patients received their surgery within six months. Compared to when the Surgical Initiative began in March 2010, there are 10,755 fewer patients waiting more than three months for surgery.

"We have seen tremendous improvement," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "Our health system has been steadily driving down wait times so surgical patients can get the care they need sooner."


SASKATCHEWAN ANTIFREEZE RECYCLING PROGRAM

By recycling used oil and filters, antifreeze, other petroleum products, and containers, we are helping to reduce the amount of contaminants entering our landfills and ecosystems.

LARGEST SINGLE-YEAR INCOME TAX REDUCTION

This is the largest single-year income tax reduction in the Province's history and will save Saskatchewan taxpayers about \$300 million per year. All income tax filers over 18 will experience a tax reduction, retroactive for 2008.

- Highest family based tax exemptions in Canada \$1,320 in tax savings per year for a family of four.
 - Families with children receive the highest personal tax exemptions in Canada a working family with two children can now earn up to \$41,300 before paying provincial income tax.
 - A working family with two children earning \$50,000 will see their Saskatchewan income taxes reduced by almost 60 per cent or \$1,320. This family will also see additional tax savings from the Low Income Tax Credit of \$227.

- 80,000 residents will no longer pay provincial income tax.
- Low income tax credit now up to \$600 for a family of four.
- Up to \$440 in tax cuts for single taxpayers.

SASKJOBS WEBSITE TRAFFIC INCREASES IN FEBRUARY

As Saskatchewan's job market continues to grow, so too does the traffic to the province's number one job site, SaskJobs.ca. Last month website traffic reached over a million, marking a 5.2 per cent year-over-year increase, another indicator of the prosperity seen in our province.

The majority of February's visits came from Saskatchewan (75 per cent), while 17 per cent came from other provinces and 8.0 per cent internationally.

Once again, visits from Alberta topped all other provinces, and increased by 35.3 per cent, while the Philippines had the highest amount of visitors among international jurisdictions, with an increase of 92.3 per cent.
