DESIGN DETAILS ANNOUNCED FOR THE NEW STADIUM



It was an exciting day for Regina and the entire province of Saskatchewan as the City of Regina, the Province of Saskatchewan and the Saskatchewan Roughrider Football Club announced the design details for a new stadium as part of the Regina Revitalization Initiative.

I was thrilled to be in attendance for the unveiling of the design details of the new stadium.

The new facility will be named Mosaic Stadium and will have a standard capacity of 33,000, and will be expandable to 40,000. The stadium will be built by PCL Construction Management Inc.,

which includes HKS Sports & Entertainment, B+H Architects and TD Securities.

"This is a very exciting time for our community and marks a significant milestone for the Regina Revitalization Initiative. We are absolutely thrilled with the design of our new stadium. It's an iconic gathering place for our community and is just the start of a revitalization effort that will influence and shape our city for generations to come," commented Mayor Michael Fougere.

Construction of the stadium will begin in June 2014 with substantial completion expected in August of 2016. The first Rider game in the new stadium will be played in June 2017.

TENTATIVE AGREEMENT REACHED WITH PROVINCE'S TEACHERS

The Government-Trustee Bargaining Committee and the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation (STF) have arrived at a tentative provincial collective bargaining agreement.

The offer includes a total compensation increase of 7.3 per cent over four years as well as a \$700 pro-rated payment in the first year. There will be funding for teachers in years three and four of the agreement in recognition of associated fees upon the establishment of a new teacher regulatory and disciplinary body in Saskatchewan.

"The Saskatchewan School Boards Association and government representatives have worked hard on this agreement with the STF," Government-Trustee Bargaining Committee spokesperson Connie Bailey said. "We are hopeful that this agreement will be ratified by the parties involved."

MANUFACTURERS SET A NEW RECORD FOR THE MONTH OF MARCH

Manufacturers in Saskatchewan continue to impress, once again setting a new shipment record - this time for the month of March.

Manufacturing shipments in the province reached \$1.3 billion in March, an 8.6 per cent increase over March 2013. The substantial increase in shipments earned Saskatchewan second place among all provinces for year-over-year growth.

Among the sectors reported, the largest year-over-year increases were seen in fabricated metal

products, up 9.9 per cent; machinery, up 6.5 per cent; and chemical products, up 4.3 per cent.

"The continued growth and record-setting trend that our manufacturing sector has seen demonstrates how diverse our economy truly is," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "This is a sector that is contributing billions of dollars annually to our economy, and it is a reflection of the growth and prosperity felt by many sectors across the province."

POTASHCORP ARK PHASE II OFFICIALLY OPENS AT SASKATOON FORESTRY FARM PARK & ZOO FEATURING PHOENIX THE RED PANDA



Officials from the City of Saskatoon, PotashCorp, Saskatoon Zoo Foundation, and Saskatoon Zoo Society took part in the opening of the PotashCorp Ark Phase II enclosure at the Saskatoon Forestry Farm Park & Zoo on May 20. Participating in the ceremony were His Worship Mayor Donald Atchison; Rhonda Speiss, Corporate Philanthropy for PotashCorp; Ivan Bergerman, Saskatoon Zoo Foundation President; and Claire Bullaro, Saskatoon Zoo Society President.

The PotashCorp Ark, located within the Zoo near the Affinity Learning Centre, was designed to feature animals never before seen in Saskatchewan. Phase I opened in 2004 and has since housed snow leopards, a Bengal tiger, a pair of white Bengal tigers, lions, cougars, and lemurs. Phase II is adjoined to the first phase to allow for the ability to create one large exhibit or two independent exhibits.

Funding to complete Phase II was made possible by the Saskatoon Zoo Foundation, and PotashCorp with a \$150,000 donation and many gifts in kind from local businesses.

"The Saskatoon Forestry Farm Park & Zoo always has amazing displays and activities, and the completion of this new phase will allow the Zoo continue to showcase animals unique to our city and continue to put Saskatoon on the map," said Mayor Donald Atchison. "We thank the Saskatoon Zoo Foundation, local business and PotashCorp for bringing this final phase to life."

WHOLESALE TRADE INCREASES IN MARCH

The value of wholesale trade in Saskatchewan continues to climb, reaching more than \$2.1 billion (seasonally adjusted) for the month of March. According to a Statistics Canada report release today, this marks an increase of 3.4 per cent over February 2014.

Wholesale trade activity earned Saskatchewan second place among the provinces for month-tomonth percentage growth; only 0.6 per cent behind the leader, Newfoundland and Labrador.

"Saskatchewan is seeing continuous growth in many sectors, and it is no surprise that wholesale trade in the province is following suit," Economy Minister Bill Boyd said. "We couldn't achieve this type of growth in wholesale trade, or any other sector, without our greatest resource, our people. Thanks to the men and women working hard in many industries across the province, we can proudly say we're home to one of Canada's most diverse and prosperous economies."

- ... Continued monthly growth in manufacturing will put Saskatchewan on pace to break last year's manufacturing shipment record of \$15.7 billion.
- ... The Saskatchewan Ministry of Highways and Infrastructure operates and maintains 26,000 km of provincial highways, 17 northern airports, 12 ferries and one barge. The ministry also regulates about 2,000 km of short line railways.
- ... Saskatchewan families can now apply for the Saskatchewan Advantage Grant for Education Savings.
- ... Since 2011, the Government of Saskatchewan has invested \$256 million to develop more than 4,500 units and repair more than 24,300 homes around the province.
