FAMILY INFORMATION LIAISON UNIT NOW OPERATIONAL

The province's new Family Information Liaison Unit (FILU) is now open and providing services to families of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls.

Funded through Justice Canada, FILU is a dedicated unit within the Ministry of Justice designed to connect families of missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls with those

organizations who can provide information about their loved ones.

"We are pleased to provide this additional support for the families of our missing and murdered Indigenous women and girls," Justice Minister and Attorney General Don Morgan said. "These families are experiencing a deep loss, and the assistance we can provide in navigating the legal system and multiple organizations who hold information will hopefully ease the stress of their situation."

FILU will also work with families and communities to help them navigate the multiple sectors of the criminal justice system and other stakeholder agencies who hold the information about their loved ones.

NOTWITHSTANDING CLAUSE INVOKED TO PROTECT PARENTS' AND STUDENTS' RIGHTS


Released on November 8, 2017 The Government of Saskatchewan introduced legislation today, invoking the notwithstanding clause of the *Canadian Charter of Rights and Freedoms*, to protect parents' choice in where they send their children to school.

The new legislation will maintain the current funding model that allows the government to fund students attending public or Catholic separate schools, regardless of their religious affiliation.

This legislation is in response to the April 2017, Court of Queen's Bench ruling that determined it is unconstitutional to fund non-Catholic students to attend Catholic separate schools. The court ruling is set to come into force on June 30, 2018, and would likely result in significant disruption to the education sector.

"The current system has served us well for more than 100 years, and parents and students wish to preserve it," Education Minister Bronwyn Eyre said. "This legislation will provide certainty for families so they can continue to attend Catholic separate schools." Continue reading here.

STAY SAFE ON THE ICE THIS WINTER



With recent colder temperatures across the province, the Government of Saskatchewan is reminding people to check for safe and sufficient ice before venturing out for ice fishing or other winter activities.

Ice thickness depends on the waterbody and surrounding conditions. Ice does not freeze at a uniform thickness and ice strength can vary considerably from one area to another.

Check the ice thickness before you travel on it. There should be at least 10 cm (4 inches) of ice to walk on, 20 cm (8 inches) to drive a snowmobile or ATV on, 30 cm (12 inches) to drive a car or light truck on, and more than 30 cm (12 inches) to drive a heavy truck on.

CHARITABLE GAMING GRANT PROGRAM PAYS MORE THAN \$800,000

Saskatchewan groups and organizations are receiving more than \$800,000 from the Saskatchewan Liquor and Gaming Authority (SLGA)'s charitable gaming grant program.

"The charitable gaming grant program provides a financial boost to community fundraising efforts across the province," Minister responsible for SLGA Gene Makowsky said. "The work of charitable groups and organizations keeps our communities vibrant and, as a government, we are grateful for the difference these volunteers make in their communities and happy to lend a hand through this program."

Among the grants provided by SLGA this quarter: Prince Albert and surrounding area received \$111,076; Weyburn/Estevan and surrounding area: \$55,869; Yorkton and surrounding area: \$52,379; Moose Jaw and surrounding area: \$50,970 and Swift Current and surrounding area: \$29,480.

RELATIONSHIP EMPHASIZED IN UPCOMING AGRICULTURE
TRADE MISSION TO JAPAN



- More than 99 per cent of Saskatchewan's exports to Japan are agri-food exports.
- In 2016, Japan was Saskatchewan's fourth largest market, with exports of \$976 million.
- Japan is Saskatchewan's largest market for nondurum wheat and fifth largest market for durum wheat.
- Japan is Saskatchewan's second largest market for canola seed exports.

Top exports to Japan:

Canola seed - \$642 million

Non-durum wheat - \$192 million

Durum wheat - \$67 million



Agriculture Minister Lyle Stewart will be in Japan on a trade mission intended to help Saskatchewan companies maintain and strengthen critical relationships while positioning the province as a reliable and quality supplier of food and agriculture products.

While in Japan from November 11-17, Stewart will bring opening remarks to the Team Canada New Crop seminar and the Canola Council of Canada (CCC) consultations in Tokyo, where he will emphasize the importance of the relationship between Japan and Saskatchewan, as well as the province's role as a global leader in agriculture.

VETERANS AND FALLEN SOLDIERS, WAR NURSES HONOURED IN SERVICE OF REMEMBRANCE



November 8th, Premier Brad Wall joined dignitaries and representatives of the provincial public service at the Legislative Building to pay tribute to Saskatchewan's veterans, those in the public service who have served, and those who gave their lives in times of conflict.

"Six-thousand, four hundred names are etched on the Saskatchewan War Memorial," Wall said. "That is 6,400 men and women who never came home to their loved ones. We honour these men and women and those from across the country who have sacrificed for our freedom."

The memorial lists the names of Saskatchewan's fallen in conflicts throughout the generations. There is also an online commemoration of those from Saskatchewan who lost their lives in war. The Saskatchewan Virtual War Memorial features more than 11,000 war casualties and their stories.

ECONOMY MINISTER TRAVELS TO INDIA ON INVESTMENT MISSION

Saskatchewan's Economy Minister Steven Bonk will be in India during the coming week to strengthen the province's trade links with one of Asia's largest markets and one of the fastest-

growing economies in the world.

Bonk's trip, which takes place from November 11–17, involves meetings with a comprehensive range of Indian business interests either engaged in or considering economic activities and investments with Saskatchewan. These include the Indo-Canadian Business Chamber, the India Pulse and Grain Association, and various other investor groups and private sector companies.

"Any increase in our trade and exports to India reinforces our relationship with one of the world's biggest customers of Saskatchewan-produced goods," Bonk said. "Our Saskatchewan Plan for Growth includes the goal of doubling the value of our total exports by 2020, and India has a vital role in contributing to our achievement of that objective."

INNOVATION SASKATCHEWAN HOSTS NETWORKING EVENT TO SPARK RESEARCH COLLABORATION IN HEALTH

Health researchers will come together on November 14 in the province's first SPARK Night, a networking and matchmaking event, to identify areas of collaboration and joint interest in their research. The event is organized and hosted by Innovation Saskatchewan, with sponsorships from the Saskatchewan Health Research Foundation, VIDO-InterVac, the Sylvia Fedoruk Canadian Centre for Nuclear Innovation and the Canadian Light Source.

Released on November 15, 2017 Winter weights take effect at 12:01 a.m., Thursday, November 16 for all applicable provincial highways, with the exception of southwest Saskatchewan.

"With Saskatchewan's export-based economy, trucking plays a major role in getting our goods to port," Highways and Infrastructure Minister David Marit said. "Winter weights season allows shippers to haul heavier loads during colder winter months, resulting in fewer trips and cost savings for the industry."


