

SASKATCHEWAN LEADS THE NATION IN JOB CREATION



Saskatchewan is leading the nation in job creation with the fastest rate of employment growth and the lowest unemployment rate in Canada.

"Having a growing and robust economy has had a huge impact on the job front," Minister responsible for Immigration, Jobs, Skills and Training Jeremy Harrison said. "It is no surprise that Saskatchewan's job growth rate is the best in the nation now, providing more employment opportunities to support and sustain strong economic momentum."

Employment was up 3.5 per cent over last September (19,300 jobs), the highest growth rate in the nation. Nationally, jobs were up 0.9 per cent. There were 574,800 people employed in Saskatchewan in September.

Lieutenant Governor Vaughn Solomon Schofield will formally open the Fourth Session of the 27th Legislature on October 22 with the Speech from the Throne in the Assembly Chamber of the Saskatchewan Legislative Building following an outdoor ceremony.

"The opening of our Legislative Assembly involves a number of traditions that remind us of the historic roots of our parliamentary democracy," Solomon Schofield said. "I'm grateful that the Government of Saskatchewan continues these traditions, because they are indicative of the value we place on our democratic institutions. I encourage members of the public to join us outside the Legislative Building to take part in the ceremony of this important day."

The public is invited to observe the outdoor ceremony which begins at 1:25 p.m. in front of the Legislative Building, 2405 Legislative Drive. The ceremony includes the arrival of the Lieutenant Governor, Vice-Regal Salute, a 15 Gun Salute from 38 Canadian Brigade Group, an inspection of a

Canadian Forces Guard of Honour comprised of regular and reserve force members from Saskatchewan, along with a flypast from 15 Wing Moose Jaw.

The formal opening of the Legislative Assembly has taken place at the onset of each session since 1906 when representatives of the Legislature, the Executive and the Judiciary first gathered to hear Lieutenant Governor Amédee Forget.

CITY EXCEEDS AGGRESSIVE TARGET RESURFACING 200 KILOMETRES OF ROADWAY

Saskatoon's unprecedented 2014 summer road construction season is coming to a close with over \$50 million spent maintaining and repairing more roads than ever before. That's 47% more than what was spent last year.

"We have paved approximately 200 lane kilometres of road this construction season, 120 kilometres more than last year, and more than the 178 kilometres we predicted we would get to this year," says Jeff Jorgenson, General Manager of Transportation and Utilities. "We've made a promise to citizens that they would begin to see an improvement in the roads and we've been delivering on that promise."

Approximately \$23.8 million was invested in road and sidewalk rehabilitation this year, more than double the previous year. A road preservation treatment or rehabilitation was completed at 100 locations across Saskatoon thanks to hundreds of City crews and contract workers, some of which worked around the clock or on a night only schedule.

TWENTY TRANSITIONAL AFFORDABLE HOUSING UNITS OPEN IN SASKATOON

The Government of Canada and the Province of Saskatchewan, along with Saskatoon Housing Coalition, celebrated the completion of a new affordable housing project in Saskatoon. These 20 bachelor-style units will benefit individuals with disabilities, and homelessness or addiction issues by providing quality housing, and accessibility in a supportive environment.

Kelly Block, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister of Natural Resources and Member of Parliament for Saskatoon–Rosetown–Biggar, on behalf of Candice Bergen, Minister of State

(Social Development), along with Central Services Minister Jennifer Campeau on behalf of Social Services Minister and Minister responsible for Saskatchewan Housing Corporation Donna Harpauer, made the announcement.

"Our government is committed to working with Saskatchewan to develop and implement local solutions to housing," said Block. "The investments here in Saskatoon are helping individuals with challenges access safe and affordable housing that meets their needs. These 20 new units are more than just safe and affordable places to live, they are key to a better life for the residents who will call them home."

"This project is an important step forward for those who require an affordable home as they work toward improving their quality of life and eventually living independently," Campeau said. "Housing is a key priority under the Saskatchewan Plan for Growth, and our government is proud of its commitment to help Saskatchewan people in greatest housing need."
