More Good News in Saskatchewan necessary



As the people of Saskatchewan settle into 2011, we continue to hear more good news about our province's economy. Our government recently learned that record high employment for the month of December meant that Saskatchewan closed 2010 with the second lowest unemployment rate in Canada. December also marked our province's 11th straight month of year-over-year employment growth and, importantly, we saw continued employment growth for First Nations and Métis people. Plus, our seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 5.5 per cent is well below the national average of 7.5 per cent. It's no surprise that more job seekers than ever are exploring career opportunities on SaskJobs.ca. The site

hosted a record 8.9 million visits in 2010 while posting more than 111,000 jobs from employers across the province. Looking forward, with eight independent economic forecasters calling for Saskatchewan to lead the country in economic growth, there are many reasons to be optimistic.

Beginning in May, some patients will receive selected diagnostic services more quickly and wait lists for those services will be reduced. The Regina Qu'Appelle Health Region has awarded a 32-month contract for the provision of computed tomography (CT) services to Radiology Associates of Regina. Services provided will include head, neck, abdominal, chest, pelvic and spinal CT scans. This initiative will address the very immediate need to improve access to this key diagnostic imaging service in southern Saskatchewan. Timely diagnosis is essential to our efforts of putting patients first and providing sooner, safer and smarter surgical care.

Negative attack ads are a fact of life in politics, but you, the taxpayer, shouldn't be paying for them. Our government has asked the NDP to support a change to the rules governing MLA expense allowances to prevent your money from being used for negative attack ads. Many other provinces already have rules in place that do not allow using taxpayer's money to fund negative political ads.

Arbor Creek School Site Plan

I was pleased to attend the Public Information Meeting this week to talk about the designated school sites in Arbor Creek. It was a great opportunity to hear the thoughts and opinions of many constituents and city officials.

The City of Saskatoon, Dundee Developments and the Erindale-Arbor Creek Community Association have done an outstanding job making sure that the 43 new lots reflect the character and charm of the existing neighborhood. Although this certainly isn't my first choice for this property, I think they have made the best of the situation. I would be remiss if I didn't thank everyone who lobbied the previous

Provincial Government from 2004 – 2007 to try to get elementary schools built in Arbor Creek. The Government at that time made their decision. I can assure you that your Saskatchewan Party Government takes a very different approach as evidenced by the two schools in Willowgrove.

Saskatoon Sports Tourism Excited to Introduce Saskatchewan to Yukigassen!



On January 28-29, 2011 Saskatoon will host North America's first organized snowball fighting tournament. Originating in Japan in 1988, Yukigassen (Japanese for "Snow Battle") has experienced a boom in popularity around the World and now it comes to Canada.

Featuring two opposing teams of seven (two members of the opposite sex per team), the goal of the game is to eliminate the competition by blasting them with snowballs (80,000 snowballs to be exact) or by capturing the flag on the other team's court. The event will take place at Delta Bessborough Gardens and will feature a festival-like atmosphere to coincide with the PotashCorp WinterShines

Festival. Event organizers at Saskatoon Sports Tourism are hoping for 47 teams of seven to nine players in one corporate/public division. Labour Force Friday

Saskatchewan has entered 2011 with the second lowest unemployment rate in Canada. Saskatchewan's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate of 5.5 per cent is well below the national average of 7.6 per cent, according to Statistics Canada's Labour Force Survey (LFS) released on January 7th.

There were 522,800 people employed in Saskatchewan in December 2010 – a record for that month and an increase of 4,200 compared to December 2009. Full-time employment jumped 7,800 over the same period.

Saskatchewan workers continue to benefit from an economy that fosters continued employment and earnings growth. In particular, Saskatchewan's private sector saw strong job growth over the past 12 months, with 11,000 new jobs created throughout the province.

December marked Saskatchewan's 11th straight month of overall employment growth, the eighth straight month of employment growth for off-reserve First Nations and Métis people and the fifth straight month of employment growth for off-reserve First Nations and Métis youth.
