Premier Wall Welcomes "Pledge to Saskatchewan" from PotashCorp



I had the opportunity to join Premier Wall and Colleagues as he accepted detailed commitments of the Potash Corporation of Saskatchewan's "Pledge to Saskatchewan."

In a letter to Premier Wall from its President and Chief Executive Officer Bill Doyle, PotashCorp outlined further details of its "Pledge to Saskatchewan" which was first announced last October.

The letter outlines specific targets for increasing the number of people working for PotashCorp in Saskatchewan, both at its Saskatoon head office and in its mines:

- 300 employees in the Saskatoon office by the end of 2013, up from 209 at the end of 2010;
- 11 of 14 senior executives working in Saskatoon by the end of this March, an increase of five; and
- 2,528 working at PotashCorp mines in Saskatchewan by 2015, up from 2,016 in 2010.

\$40 Million in Additional Funding to Improve Health Care in Saskatchewan

Saskatchewan's government is providing more than \$40 million in additional funding for the Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative this year, so that more patients receive surgery sooner.

- More than 5,500 additional surgeries performed this year;
- More surgeons and anesthesiologists to perform the extra operations;
- · More nurses in operating rooms; and
- A safer patient experience through improved surgical equipment and renovations to operating rooms and recovery ward.

Ultimately, the additional funding is about reducing surgical wait times for patients to less than 12 months by the end of 2012 and to no more than three months by 2014. Wait times have already dropped significantly. Since 2007, the number of patients waiting more than 12 months for surgery has dropped more than 27 per cent - the number of people waiting longer than 18 months is down by more than 50 per cent.
