NEW SCHOOL CAPITAL PROJECT FUNDING ANNOUNCED FOR SASKATOON



Saskatoon received fantastic news Wednesday, February 23, 2011 when Education Minister Donna Harpauer announced over \$60 million in additional funding for school renovation and improvement projects across the province. This funding that will help address enrollment and renovation pressures being felt in schools and school-based child care centres across the province. I was very

pleased with Minister Harpauer's announcement as it demonstrates our government's commitment to strengthen the education systems across the province and right here in Saskatoon. "Willowgrove continues to show tremendous growth and this funding will provide Willowgrove families and their children additional education options and help expand our infrastructure to meet the needs of a growing city and province. Saskatoon will receive more than \$11.3 million for school infrastructure upgrades and two new schools. More than \$6.2 million of that funding will move the design and construction ahead for the new Willowgrove Public and Catholic school projects which are located in the Silver Springs constituency and were given Approval-in-Principle in March, 2010. Forest Grove Public School is also receiving \$54,000 to help them move forward on a roof replacement project. The Government of Saskatchewan has committed more than \$401.13 million since November 2007 to move forward 29 major school capital projects and about 570 additional smaller school capital projects across the province. This represents a record high investment in school infrastructure over a three year period.

Positive Announcements in Healthcare - \$133.1 Million in Additional Funding

My colleague, Health Minister Don McMorris has recently announced the following this Capital Funding:

- \$49.3 million 13 Long-term Care Facilities
- Additional design costs and initial construction costs for the replacement of aged facilities in 13 communities across Saskatchewan. Work has begun in Watrous, and the project in Shellbrook is expected to go to tender soon. Tender dates are expected later in 2011-12 for projects in these communities: Maple Creek, Biggar, Kerrobert, Rosetown, Meadow Lake, Prince Albert, Kelvington, Tisdale, Kipling, Radville and Redvers.
- \$42.7 million Facility Capital Repairs and Equipment
- \$24 million Equipment: Upgrading equipment for diagnostic imaging, medical/surgical procedures, patient comfort and safety, laboratory work and rehabilitation.
- \$18.7 million Block Funding: Life safety/emergency systems and infrastructure deficiencies. Health regions address pressing maintenance, repairs and safety equipment needs of their facilities.
- \$8 million Electronic Health Record
- eHealth Saskatchewan development of a "one patient/one record" health information system.
- \$7.1 million Parkridge Centre
- Significant repairs and equipment upgrades to Saskatoon special care home.
- \$5.0 million Moose Jaw Union Hospital Regeneration
- Detailed planning.
- \$500,000 Melfort CT Services
- Work to enable operation of a computed tomography scanner for diagnostic and treatment procedures.
- Physician-related Funding
- \$10.5 million Physician Recruitment and Retention
- To support activities to attract new doctors and keep existing doctors in Saskatchewan.
- \$10 million Physician Reimbursement
- Support for an increased number of physician services....

Saskatchewan now has three curling teams representing Canada on the world stage. The Trish Paulsen foursome of Saskatoon will carry Canada's flag at the World Junior Women's Championships and the Braeden Moskowy team of Regina will be representing Canada at the World Junior Men's Championships. Both competitions will be held in Perth, Scotland, March 5-13, 2011. Saskatchewan is well represented on the world stage. Regina's Pat Simmons will represent Saskatchewan at the Brier which will be held in London, Ontario from March 5-13.

Nominations Open for Premier's Award

Saskatchewan residents have until April 29, 2011 to nominate provincial employees for the 2011 Premier's Award for Excellence in the Public Service. The award recognizes individuals who have made outstanding contributions to the government and citizens of the province. It gives you the opportunity to say thank you, while celebrating the work that they do for all of us. The award recognizes those public servants who have made exceptional contributions to the people of Saskatchewan. Individuals or teams from government ministries, some Treasury Board Crown corporations, boards, commissions and agencies are eligible for nomination by the public service, stakeholder organizations, clients and the public. Selections are made by an independent committee. Up to six awards will be announced during National Public Service Week in June, with the presentation event occurring in the fall.

U OF S Will See New Centre for Nuclear Medicine and Materials

Premier Brad Wall and my colleague, Rob Norris, Minister responsible for Innovation announced \$30 million in funding over seven years to establish a new research Centre at the University of Saskatchewan that will re-establish the province as an international leader in nuclear science and nuclear medicine. This is another important step in re-capturing that international leadership position in nuclear medicine and expanding it to include research in materials science and small reactor design. The province's \$30 million investment in nuclear research builds on January's announcement of \$12 million in funding from the federal and provincial governments to build a new linear accelerator and support research into the production of medical isotopes at the Canadian Light Source.

The new Centre will make Saskatchewan the focal point for nuclear research and development in Western Canada. It will spark research partnerships with industry, universities and other research institutions. Work will include development of advanced materials for construction, aerospace and small reactor designs, and medical imaging for diagnosis of cancer and heart disease. I look forward to more exciting announcements here at the University of Saskatchewan in the days and weeks to come that will build on today's investment in nuclear research.

Did you know???

- 55 per cent of businesses in Saskatchewan say the overall state of business is good (39 per cent nationally); 40 per cent say it is satisfactory (46 per cent nationally).
- 28 per cent of Saskatchewan businesses plan to increase full-time employment in the next 3-4 months (16 per cent nationally) and only eight per cent plan to decrease (10 per cent nationally).
- The shortage of skilled labour (47 per cent) is identified as the main business constraint.
- Major cost concerns causing difficulties for small business include: fuel/energy costs (61 per cent), tax/regulatory costs (57 per cent), and wage costs (54 per cent).
