PET-CT SCAN FOR SASKATCHEWAN PART OF SIGNIFICANT NUCLEAR INVESTMENT

A \$17 million government investment in an advanced research cyclotron sets the stage for a \$6 million investment that will bring PET-CT (Positron Emission Tomography - Computerized Tomography) scan services to Saskatchewan. The cyclotron will enable the production of the isotopes needed to provide the PET-CT program to Saskatchewan patients. The cyclotron will also support research into the direct production of Technetium-99, the most widely used medical isotope in the world.

The introduction of PET-CT treatment and research services is a very positive step forward for patients in Saskatchewan. Patients will no longer have to travel outside of the province to receive this service. We can now provide the highest quality care and the latest treatments close to home.

Today's \$17 million investment for a cyclotron includes \$10 million from the Government of Saskatchewan and \$7 million from the Government of Canada. The research cyclotron announced today will generate short-lived, radioactive PET-CT isotopes, required to support the delivery of a new provincial PET-CT medical imaging program.

<u>SETTING THE RECORD STRAIGHT ON POTASH ROYALTIES</u>

- Our government is protecting the jobs for all those working in our growing potash industry and feels royalty reviews have serious implications.
- In 2007 Alberta's government proposed up to a 20 per cent increase in royalties for energy companies. The response? Investment dollars left Alberta along with thousands of jobs.
- A full-scale potash royalty review would put current plans for billions of dollars in mine expansion and new mine construction, plus thousands of new jobs, at risk.
- Not only does a royalty review pose a serious threat to the stability of the investment climate in Saskatchewan, our Government believes it doesn't make sense.
- Presently, potash royalties are already twice as high as any other jurisdiction in the world.
- A word of caution for those who say Saskatchewan can charge whatever it wants for potash, given that we have roughly half of the global potash supply. This also means half is being produced in other parts of the world. If Saskatchewan fails to remain competitive, potash expansions will occur elsewhere.
- Right now, we are competitive and that has resulted in the creation of thousands of jobs and billions of dollars being spent in our province. Potash companies will invest more than \$12 billion in Saskatchewan over the next decade and increase provincial capacity by roughly 65 per cent. About 19,000 person-years of employment will be created through construction, followed by a permanent increase of 1,500 high-paying, industry jobs.
- The Conference Board of Canada recently predicted that Saskatchewan will lead the country in economic growth both this year and next and that the potash industry will play a significant role. Why would we want to put that growth at risk?

Our Government remains committed to moving our province forward.

SASKJOBS.CA ROLLS ON WITH IMPRESSIVE FEBRUARY NUMBERS

As Saskatchewan's largest job-matching website, SaskJobs.ca is a window to thousands of opportunities in every corner of the province. SaskJobs.ca hosted 811,000 visits in February - a record for that month and a 19 per cent increase over February 2010. Visits from outside Canada jumped by an impressive 74 per cent. The site provides job posting services free of charge for employers across the province and free résumé posting for job seekers around the world.



Did You Know???

2011 marked the 100th anniversary of International Women's Day.

- Saskatchewan was rated the third-best mining investment jurisdiction in the world by the Fraser Institute in the international Annual Survey of Mining Companies 2010/2011. In 2009/2010, Saskatchewan was ranked sixth.
- Private and public investment in Saskatchewan is expected to reach a record \$17 billion in 2011.
 This is a 7.2 percent increase over 2010 and the second highest percentage increase in the nation.
- The Conference Board of Canada is forecasting that Saskatchewan will lead the country with growth rates of 3.9 per cent and 4.5 per cent in 2011 and 2012, respectively. Seven of nine private sector forecasters agree that Saskatchewan will be first in growth next year.
- Firefighter training program now offered in Saskatchewan at Parkland College in Melville.
