

<u>SPECIAL MEDIATOR APPOINTED - Job Action to End While Mediator Seeks</u> <u>Settlement</u>

I have received many letters and phone calls regarding the dispute between the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation and the Government-Trustee Bargaining Committee (Saskatchewan School Boards Association and the Government of Saskatchewan).

I am encouraged that both parties have agreed to work with the mediator in an effort to reach a fair settlement and have agreed to suspend all job action and advertising activity until the mediation process reaches a resolution.

At the request of both parties, Labour Relations and Workplace Safety Minister and Attorney General Don Morgan has appointed Richard Hornung, Q.C. as special mediator to help end the dispute between the Saskatchewan Teachers' Federation and the Government-Trustee Bargaining Committee (Saskatchewan School Boards Association and the Government of Saskatchewan).

As my colleague Don Morgan said, "We are hopeful that appointing a special mediator will assist the parties in concluding a collective agreement.

The special mediator will examine any issues in dispute and focus on assisting the parties to reach consensus on outstanding differences. Hornung is a well known and accomplished mediator, conciliator and arbitrator with a national practice based in Calgary. He is a former Professor of Law at the University of Alberta, was a senior partner specializing in Civil Litigation, Labour Law and Alternative Dispute Resolution and was Vice Chair (currently in a part time capacity) of the Canada Industrial Relations Board. He has also served as Chair of the Saskatchewan Labour Relations Board.

If the special mediator is unable to obtain consensus between the parties on outstanding issues prior to June 10, 2011, he will prepare a report for consideration by the Minister and Cabinet, setting out the findings of the mediation and providing recommendations for the resolution of the outstanding issues.

CELEBRATE TOURISM AWARENESS WEEK

Tourism Saskatoon is launching a prize-per-day contest in celebration of Saskatchewan's Tourism Awareness Week June 5 – 11. Starting June 5, the public can enter a new contest each day on Tourism Saskatoon's mobile site (<u>http://m.tourismsaskatoon.com</u>).

Tourism is important to Saskatoon's economy and this is an opportune time to draw attention to our city's impressive tourism offerings, and celebrate the experiences and memories they create for our visitors.

The prize for each day of the contest and the winner's name will be announced the following morning on Tourism Saskatoon's Twitter and Facebook accounts. The trivia question participants are required to answer will give a good indication of what the prize will be.

According to estimated figures by Tourism Saskatchewan, travel and tourism in Saskatoon alone generated an approximate \$529.6 million in travel receipts in 2010. In August 2009, there were approximately 13,115 people employed in tourism-related jobs in Saskatoon.

Total traveller expenditures in the province of Saskatchewan were \$1.634 billion in 2009, employing more than 62,000 people in the tourism sector. It is estimated that seven out of 10 workers got their first job in Saskatchewan's tourism industry.

Tourism Week in Canada is June 6 – 12. This is the national celebration of Canada's tourism sector, and is organized by several public and private tourism stakeholders.

TOURISM SASKATOON OPENS SEASONAL VISITOR INFORMATION CENTRE

Tourism Saskatoon recently announced the opening of the seasonal Visitor Information Centre located at Avenue C North and 47th Street West. They will be open daily from 8:30 am to 5:30 pm until September 6, 2011.

The main Visitor Information Centre located downtown at 202 Fourth Avenue North will operate with extended hours: 8:15 am to 5:30 pm Monday through Friday, and 8:30 am to 5:30 pm on weekends and holidays.

Tourism Saskatoon will provide information to visitors about festivals, events, attractions, accommodation, shopping, dining, and other activities.

SOUTH SASKATCHEWAN RIVER CAUTION

The public is advised to exercise caution as the South Saskatchewan River flowing through Saskatoon will continue to rise even higher over the next four days to 1470 cubic metres per second by Sunday, June 5. River banks will be more unstable and many areas have steep drop-offs into a swift current.

Canoeing is not recommended on the river in water flowing faster than 600 cubic metres per second. The danger is higher along the shoreline when canoeists may get caught and held under debris.

- 58% of businesses in Saskatchewan say the overall state of business is good (37% nationally); 36% say it is satisfactory (47% nationally).
- 28% of Saskatchewan businesses plan to increase full-time employment in the next 3-4 months (18% nationally) and only four per cent plan to decrease (12 % nationally).
