I hope everyone enjoyed the parade to kick off the annual Saskatoon Exhibition. Special thanks to Ken Sawatsky for driving the antique fire truck and to all the children who participated. This fire truck was used as the fire engine in the town of Strasbourg from 1944 to 1958.

The weather was fantastic at the annual Saskatoon Exhibition resulting in record breaking numbers this year, with 33,825 people attending the event on Sunday, culminating in a six day event total of 216,856, breaking the 2009 record by 1,380 people (0.6%).

I had a great time attending with my wife Trish and children Carter and Paige. Special thanks to the organizers and entertainers for making the exhibition such an outstanding success. The support of the annual exhibition was overwhelming. 125 years of fun!!

SASKATCHEWAN EXPORTS CONTINUE STEADY RISE

Saskatchewan's goods continue to be in high demand, generating \$2.3 billion for provincial businesses in June. This was an increase of 29.6 per cent over June 2010 according to the latest merchandise exports report by Statistics Canada.

The last six months showed a similar upward swing of 13.3 per cent, which totalled \$13.7 billion in merchandise exports over the same period in 2010.

The Statistics Canada report noted strong increases for Saskatchewan, especially in the agricultural, energy, automotive and industrial sectors.

MINIMUM WAGE TO INCREASE SEPTEMBER 1, 2011

Employers and minimum wage earners are reminded that Saskatchewan's minimum wage is going up effective September 1, 2011.

The Government of Saskatchewan will increase the province's minimum wage from \$9.25 to \$9.50 per hour, which will also result in a corresponding increase to the minimum call-out pay to \$28.50.

This increase will affect approximately 22,000 minimum wage earners in Saskatchewan, representing approximately five per cent of the paid workforce in Saskatchewan.

SASKATCHEWAN WHOLESALE TRADE BEST IN CANADA

Saskatchewan's wholesale trade increased by an impressive 35 per cent in June 2011 compared to June 2010, according to Statistics Canada. That gives the province the highest percentage increase in Canada.

On a monthly basis, Saskatchewan's wholesale trade increased by 3.6 per cent between May 2011 and June 2011, the third highest increase among the provinces. Nationally, wholesale trade was up 0.2 per cent.

MANUFACTURING SALES INCREASE TEN TIMES THE NATIONAL RATE

Saskatchewan led the country in manufacturing sales during the month of June; an increase almost ten times the national average, according to a report on manufacturing sales released by Statistics Canada.

In June 2011, manufacturing sales were up by 21 per cent over June 2010, the highest increase among the provinces and well ahead of the 2.3 per cent posted nationally over the same period (seasonally adjusted). Sales were also up between May 2011 and June 2011, rising by 0.7 per cent, third highest in Canada and much better than the 1.5 per cent decline on a national level.

NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR SASKATCHEWAN VOLUNTEER MEDAL

Saskatchewan residents have until October 18 to nominate individuals for the Saskatchewan Volunteer Medal. The Volunteer Medal recognizes individuals who have provided outstanding volunteer service or exceptional community involvement.

We count on volunteers to fill a multitude of important roles. The Saskatchewan Volunteer Medal is a chance for us to acknowledge these committed individuals who make such valuable contributions to our province, and I encourage everyone to consider nominating a deserving volunteer.

Any Canadian citizen who is a current or former long-term resident of Saskatchewan is eligible. Nominations cannot be accepted for sitting members of Parliament, the Legislature, or the judiciary who currently hold office. Groups or organizations cannot be nominated. Posthumous nominations are not accepted.

THE SASKATCHEWAN HOCKEY HALL OF FAME

The Saskatchewan Hockey Hall of Fame is organizing the first ever call to the hall. The inaugural class of the new Saskatchewan Hockey Hall of Fame is set to be inducted in July of 2012, but potential inductees are still needed. Do you know of someone who is special to the hockey world and has Saskatchewan ties? This is your chance to get them recognized.

Nominations can be made in five categories: Builder, Grassroots Contributor, Player, Official and Team.

Nominations must be received at the Saskatchewan Hockey of Fame by 5:00 pm on September 1. For information on the nomination processor or for the nomination forms visit www.saskhockeyhalloffame.com. Nominations can be made via email or fax, but hard copies will also need to be mailed to the induction selection committee.

The Hall of Fame is to be located in Swift Current in the recently upgraded I-Plex. The first ever nominees will also be introduced at the Saskatoon Blades game in January.
