INTERNATIONAL VACCINE CENTRE (INTERVAC) OFFICIALLY OPEN AT U OF S

Premier Brad Wall and University of Saskatchewan (U of S) President Peter MacKinnon officially opened the International Vaccine Centre (InterVac) at the Saskatoon campus today.

InterVac is part of the renowned U of S Vaccine and Infectious Disease Organization (VIDO) and will be a key player in Canada's vaccine preparedness strategy.

The Government of Saskatchewan has committed more than \$57 million to InterVac. Total cost of the centre is \$140 million.

"We are pleased to partner in this exciting new research development that will benefit all Canadians," Wall said. "This investment will further enhance Saskatchewan's growing reputation for innovative research and world-class life science facilities."

InterVac will develop vaccines to protect people and animals from the threat of emerging or persistent diseases such as avian influenza or tuberculosis. This new building will be one of the largest and most advanced Containment Level 3 facilities in the world for both human and large animal infectious diseases.

"We are grateful for the support and confidence of our partners in this outstanding vaccine research and development facility, which holds enormous potential to make significant headway against existing and emerging diseases," MacKinnon said.

The centre is expected to be operational in early 2012.

Since 2008, the Government of Saskatchewan has invested over \$356 million in capital throughout the post-secondary system.

Among those in attendance was Prime Minister Stephen Harper.

FUNDING CONTINUED FOR THE ENERGY EFFICIENT NEW HOMES REBATE PROGRAM

The province's Go Green Fund will provide an operating grant of \$500,000 to SaskEnergy for continued delivery of the Energy Efficient New Homes Rebate Program. The program was developed in 2007 to provide a rebate to homeowners who have built or purchased a newly constructed ENERGY STAR® qualified, R-2000 certified, or an EnerGuide for New Homes rating of 80 or above home.

"Our government is committed to helping Saskatchewan people Go Green," Environment Minister Dustin Duncan said. "We are continuing to fund the Energy Efficient New Homes Rebate Program because it encourages homeowners to build new homes to higher energy efficiency standards and reduces energy and water resource use."

Homeowners are eligible for a rebate of \$1,000 for building or purchasing a new home that is qualified or certified to these specifications. New homeowners must complete the rebate form in full and mail it, along with the required documents, to SaskEnergy within 12 months of their new home possession date. SaskEnergy administers the program on behalf of Go Green.

In the first four years of this program, 1,325 homeowners received rebates. To-date, approximately 3,675 tonnes of greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions have been reduced annually as each new energy efficient home reduces approximately three tonnes of GHGs per year, compared to new houses built to the minimum building standard.

SASKATOON CORRECTIONAL CENTRE'S URBAN CAMP GARDEN HARVEST GOES TO SUPPORT COMMUNITY

The 2011 harvest has ended for the offenders from the Saskatoon Correctional Centre's Urban Camp, and the bounty is all being donated to the Saskatoon Food Bank and St. Mary's Community School.

"At the same time offenders are learning work skills that will help them reduce their chances for reoffending when they're released, community members with limited resources also benefit," Corrections, Public Safety and Policing Minister D.F. (Yogi) Huyghebaert said.

This year marks the second year of a partnership between the Saskatoon Correctional Centre, the Food Bank and St. Mary's. The harvest from this season alone will see more than 3,200 hamper bags of produce provided to these organizations.

"This donation makes a difference to the clients who use our services, and we are pleased to be a partner in this important community initiative," Saskatoon Food Bank CEO Paul Merriman said.

"Our school lunch program is aimed to provide nutritious food to help our students perform better in school, and this donation helps us honour that commitment," St Mary's Community School Principal Tony Bairos said.

Urban camp offenders and staff maintain and grow a wide variety of vegetables over the summer for harvest in the fall. Gardeners are supplied with seeds, gardening tools and construction material through donations from Early's Farm and Garden Centre, Floral Acres and Hamm Construction.

The Urban Camp program has been in existence for 29 years, and provides offenders who are nearing release with work experience geared to supporting the community.

25 YEAR OLD WITH A PASSION TO FIND A CURE FOR PARKINSON'S DISEASE

Gerry Dee Live in Saskatoon for 3rd Annual Lows in Motion Parkinson's Fundraiser

Looking to make a difference for People Living with Parkinson's (PLWP) disease, Travis Low, who is a Silver Spring resident, along with the help of a volunteer committee have raised over \$100,000 for Parkinson's Society of Saskatchewan over the past 3 years.

Travis is passionate about The Lows In Motion event and has done an incredible job with this amazing project. His father, Dwayne Low, and grandfather, Richard Low, have both been diagnosed with the disease.

In his youth, Travis witnessed his grandfather's mobility and demeanor wane. It was hard to believe that the man once known for his integral and compassionate contributions to the war effort, community and family could succumb to disease to that extent.

Five years ago Travis' father was similarly diagnosed with Parkinson's at the age of 48. Since that time his family has watched the progressive aspects of the disease take its toll on Dwayne both physically and cognitively at a rate far more worrisome than had afflicted his grandfather. Seeing Dwayne experience the progressive stages of the disease at such a young age inspired Travis to research existing initiatives and non-profits his family and friends could support.

Travis' first fundraiser was initially supposed to be a small dance of university students with a goal to raise \$10,000. However, after given the suggestion to have a silent and live auction, the dance bloomed to 350 people that raised \$23,000. The 2nd annual event was also a success and garnered involvement from like-minded volunteers, many of whom also have family or friends afflicted by the disease. Due to the success of these events, the Lows in Motion Committee have set their goals for our 3rd annual event at Hall A at Prairieland Park high. Their hope is to raise \$50,000 this year.

The entertainment for the evening includes a silent auction, raffle, and late lunch. The live entertainment is quality and diverse ranging from the very talented local Jazz duo Maurice Drouin and Heidi Munro, the cabaret band Nokyo playing classic rock with the headlining finale, the renowned celebrity comedian Gerry Dee. Dee is best known for his third-place finish on NBC's Last Comic Standing and his television character on The Score ("Gerry Dee–Sports Reporter").

All proceeds from this event are donated to the Parkinson Society Saskatchewan. The Parkinson's Society is the voice of people living with Parkinson's in Saskatchewan and their purpose is to ease the burden of the disease by offering support services, education, advocacy and research for a cure. WATCH FOR NEW HEALTH CARD RENEWAL STICKERS

Saskatchewan residents are being urged to keep an eye on their mail box over the next few weeks for an important package containing renewal stickers for their Saskatchewan Health Services Card. The majority of provincial health cards expire on December 31, 2011 and the renewal stickers will validate health cards to December 31, 2014.

"The Saskatchewan Health Services Card is a valuable personal identification card, which confirms that a Saskatchewan resident is entitled to health coverage under the provincial health insurance plan," Health Minister Don McMorris said. "It is important that residents always carry a valid health card and present it when receiving health services. As soon as you receive your renewal sticker, please take a moment to place it on the upper right corner of your health card."

Residents are also asked to check the accuracy of information listed on the form at the bottom of their renewal letter and contact Health Registration Branch only if that information needs to be updated. Residents will not be able to receive insured health benefits without a valid Saskatchewan Health Services Card.

The health card renewal packages will be mailed out between September 15 and 30. While the success rate of reaching residents is over 90 per cent, there are always those who are missed because they have not advised Saskatchewan Health of changes to their personal circumstances such as address changes, moves out of province or changes in marital status. Residents who have not received their renewal stickers by mid-October should contact Health Registration Branch by mail at 100-1942 Hamilton Street, Regina, S4P 4W2; email at <u>hcrenewal@health.gov.sk.ca</u>; fax at 306-787-8951 or by phone at 306-787-3251 or 1-800-667-7551.

The Saskatchewan Health Services card is revalidated every three years, by placing the renewal sticker on the current health card. Health cards were last revalidated in 2008. More than 616,000 Saskatchewan households will be receiving health card renewal packages this year. In addition to the renewal sticker(s), HealthLine sticker(s) with the HealthLine phone number, and organ donor sticker(s) and consent card(s), are included in the renewal package. Residents 18 years or age of older who choose to become an organ donor need to attach the organ donor sticker to their health card, sign the organ donor consent card and keep both in their wallet.

SASKATCHEWAN MANUFACTURING SHIPMENTS THE BEST IN CANADA

Saskatchewan's manufacturing sector continued to see strong gains in July, as shipments in the province posted the largest percentage increase in the nation.

Manufacturing shipments were up 18.1 per cent in July 2011 over July 2010 (seasonally adjusted). Nationally, manufacturing shipments were up only 6.9 per cent over the same period.
