SWEARING IN CEREMONY- NOVEMBER 30



There are now 15 new Saskatchewan Party MLAs officially on the job.

All 49 government MLAs were sworn in during the official ceremony at the Legislature.

The 49 Saskatchewan Party MLAs elected earlier this month officially took their oath of office today at a



swearing-in ceremony at the Saskatchewan Legislature. On November 7, 2011, the majority of Saskatchewan people voted for a vision that

would continue to move the province forward, by electing 15 more Saskatchewan Party MLAs to represent them in the Legislature.

"We are humbled by the trust placed in us by the people of Saskatchewan," said Premier Brad Wall. "We will honour that trust by continuing to build on our record of keeping promises. We will stick to the simple formula that guided us through the last four years – doing what we said will do."

"This coming Monday Saskatchewan Party MLAs, many for the first time, will take their seats in the Legislative Assembly for the Speech from the Throne. In the speech, our government will move forward with the plan we outlined in the election - management of a growing economy, responsible, affordable spending and targeted measures to make life more affordable for students, seniors, families and persons with disabilities," Wall said.

Of the 49 government MLAs, 15 are new – representing constituencies where either a long-serving Saskatchewan Party member decided to step down or, in many cases, to replace Opposition members.

Wall added, "Whether someone has served seven terms like Moosomin MLA Don Toth, or are entering public life for the first time, like many of our new MLAs, the Saskatchewan Party government has been entrusted by the people of Saskatchewan with an opportunity to build for the future - because the only day better than today in Saskatchewan is tomorrow in Saskatchewan."

The fall session of the Saskatchewan Legislature will begin with the Throne Speech on December 5, 2011.

PREMIER CALLS NEW LEGISLATIVE ASSEMBLY TO MEET ON DECEMBER 5

Shortest Time Ever Between Election and Start of Session

Premier Brad Wall today announced that the first session of the newly-elected Legislative Assembly will begin on Monday, December 5.

That will be the shortest period of time - 28 days - between a provincial election and the first sitting of the Legislative Assembly in Saskatchewan history, breaking the previous record of 33 days set by the current government in its first term following the 2007 election.

The session will begin with the election of the Speaker in the morning followed by the Throne Speech in the afternoon of December 5. Wall said the Throne Speech will reflect government's plan to keep the commitments it made during the recent election campaign.

"Our government will keep Saskatchewan moving forward with the vision and the plan we outlined in the election - a growing economy, responsible, affordable spending and targeted measures to make life more affordable for students, seniors, families and persons with disabilities," Wall said. "We are honoured and humbled by the trust Saskatchewan people have placed in our government and we will work every day to be worthy of that trust."

Surgical Initiative Continues To Build Momentum

More patients are receiving surgeries sooner in Saskatchewan, as health regions advance Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative projects that promote sooner, safer, smarter care.

"Patients are increasingly seeing the benefits of the many Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative projects that are underway," Health Minister Don McMorris said. "We're supporting system changes in all aspects of surgical care - from diagnosis and specialist referral through surgery and recovery. That big picture approach is starting to pay off."

Saskatchewan hospitals have provided more than 41,100 surgeries in the first six months of 2011-12, eight per cent more than during the same period last year.

The government remains on track to balance the provincial budget, despite increased flooding expenses and an uncertain global economy.

The Mid-Year Report anticipates a pre-transfer surplus of \$25 million and a balance in the Growth and Financial Security Fund of \$694 million at year end.

Overall expenses are expected to be up \$246.8 million to \$10.926 billion, while revenues are expected to be up by \$156.8 million to \$10.951 billion, leaving a \$25 million surplus. Flooding costs are estimated to be in excess of \$240 million, offset by approximately \$109 million in federal contributions.

"We are extremely fortunate that we have the resources to respond to a second consecutive year of extensive flooding," Finance Minister Ken Krawetz said. "Our government has ensured we have an appropriate reserve in the Growth and Financial Security Fund and it remains in place to respond to such challenges."

NOW HIRING! STUDENTS ENCOURAGED TO APPLY FOR SUMMER JOBS

The Government of Saskatchewan is encouraging students to apply now for summer positions with the public service.

"We're opening our application process earlier this year to accommodate those students who like to apply for jobs well in advance," Minister responsible for the Public Service Commission June Draude said. REPORT FORECASTS IMPRESSIVE GDP GROWTH FOR SASKATCHEWAN

The Conference Board of Canada released its Autumn 2011 Provincial Outlook Executive Summary today and is forecasting Saskatchewan will have the best GDP growth in Canada this year with real GDP expected to rise by 5.1 per cent.

"Saskatchewan is experiencing its strongest growth, both economically and population-wise, in history," Enterprise Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "Much of the growth is due to our resource sector, which is investing in Saskatchewan for the long-term."

Saskatchewan's average wages are the second highest in the country for the first time since records have been recorded and, for the first time, passed Ontario in weekly earnings. Average weekly earnings were \$906.22 in September 2011, the second highest among all provinces, behind Alberta, and above the national average of \$872.75.

"Saskatchewan continues to offer competitive wages for its workers in comparison with the rest of Canada," Advanced Education, Employment and Immigration Minister Rob Norris said. "The fact that our average weekly earnings are second highest in the country speaks to our strong economy and why this is a great time to be working in Saskatchewan."

RETAIL SALES NEARLY DOUBLE NATIONAL AVERAGE

September's retail sales shot up 8.1 per cent over the same month in 2010, the highest percentage increase among the provinces and almost double the 4.2 per cent recorded nationally on a seasonally adjusted basis.

"As incomes in Saskatchewan rise we are seeing that translating into busy stores across the province," Enterprise Minister Jeremy Harrison said. "This is excellent news for our economy as we approach Christmas."

On a monthly basis, Saskatchewan's retail sales were up 1.7 per cent in September 2011 over August 2011, the fourth-highest increase in Canada. Nationally, retail sales were up just 1.0 per cent.

"This is another sign of the confidence and optimism people in Saskatchewan have for the future," Harrison said. "With so many jobs and opportunities available, consumers are able to enjoy a higher quality of life in our province."
