CONGRATULATIONS TO OUR OLYMPIC ATHLETES

Our Province's Athletes Bring Home Three Medals

The Government of Saskatchewan thanks the Saskatchewan athletes who competed in the 2012 Summer Olympic Games for being wonderful provincial and national ambassadors. Government also wishes to thank the coaches, officials and support staff from our province for their contributions to the Games.



"Congratulations, athletes, on a successful Summer Olympic Games," Parks, Culture and Sport Minister Kevin Doherty said. "Canada might be well-known for its winter sports, but you showed the world that our province and our nation produce skilled summer athletes, too. Coaches, officials and staff, thank you for your dedication to competitive sport."

Three Saskatchewan athletes won Olympic medals. Rower Rachelle Viinberg (Regina) and her teammates won the silver medal in the Women's Eight Rowing competition.

Kaylyn Kyle and Kelly Parker, both from Saskatoon, won bronze medals playing for the Canadian Olympic Women's Soccer team. This is the first Summer Olympic team sport medal for Canada since 1936, when the Summer Olympic Games were held in Berlin.


Seven athletes hailing from Saskatchewan flew to London to compete for Canada.

Cory Niefer (Saskatoon) competed in the Men's 10-metre Air Rifle and 50-Metre Rifle Prone competitions. Krista Phillips (Saskatoon) played basketball for the Canadian Olympic Women's Basketball team. Reuben Ross (Pilot Butte) competed in the Men's Synchronized 3-Metre Springboard Diving competition. Brianne Theisen (Humboldt) competed in the Women's Heptathlon.

The Summer Olympic Games wrapped up Sunday, August 12 in London. The Summer Paralympic Games will take place August 29 to September 9.

RECORD BREAKING YEAR FOR THE SASKATOON EXHIBITION

CHILD CARE FUNDING INCREASES

The Government of Saskatchewan is once again offering child care facilities funding to provide professional development opportunities for staff and board members. Since the grants were introduced in 2009, early childhood educators, centre directors, board members, cooks, family child care home providers and their assistants, have accessed a variety of professional development opportunities to enhance the quality of care provided to children.

"The Government of Saskatchewan recognizes that high-quality early childhood experiences contribute significantly to young people's future success," Education Minister Russ Marchuk said. "Professional development for licensed child care staff and board members helps ensure children have the best possible care during such an important time in their development."

FIRST PARTICIPANT LEAVING FOR GROUND-BREAKING MS CLINICAL TRIAL

The first Saskatchewan resident will fly to Albany, New York on Monday morning for the final stage of eligibility screening for a clinical trial of the effectiveness of Chronic Cerebro-Spinal Venous Insufficiency (CCSVI) in relieving symptoms of multiple sclerosis (MS).

The provincial government committed \$2.2 million to have Saskatchewan patients participate in the Albany clinical trial to further research in this area and allow Saskatchewan residents to play an active role in MS research.

"This is a ground-breaking day for our province and for science," Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "I wish Andrew a safe journey and thank him for his willingness to help advance our knowledge about the value of CCSVI as a treatment for MS."

FIGHTING THE MOUNTAIN PINE BEETLES

Saskatchewan will contribute \$450,000 to mountain pine beetle control efforts in Alberta as the two provinces work together to aggressively detect and remove infested trees at the leading edge of the infestation in eastern Alberta. The partnership agreement provides a framework for a comprehensive regional strategy to combat the beetle before it gets established in Canada's jack pine forests and aims to stop or significantly slow the beetle's spread into Saskatchewan's north.

"The mountain pine beetle represents a significant threat to Saskatchewan's pine forests and to the environmental, social and economic contributions they make to our quality of life," Environment Minister Ken Cheveldayoff said. "Working with Alberta provides our best chance of preventing this insect from becoming established in our majestic northern forest."

The Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup (GCSC) aims to promote understanding and education about shoreline litter issues by encouraging Canadians to rehabilitate shoreline areas through cleanups. It began with a cleanup by a small group of Vancouver Aquarium employees in 1994. Today, the cleanup has spread across the nation! In 2011, there were 1,665 GCSC sites across Canada – 56,293 participants clean up 3,144km, gathering 11,794 bags weighing 143,737kg!

This year's event will take place on Saturday, September 22, but if you register before August 31 you will receive a free GCSC t-shirt! I encourage you to join the Great Canadian Shoreline Cleanup and make a contribution to our city's beautiful green spaces. The cleanup will wrap up with a BBQ and pets are welcome.

- There is a \$6 million net increase for the Saskatchewan Children and Youth Agenda.
- There is \$4.6 million in Budget 2012-13 to establish the Saskatchewan Advantage Scholarship Program that provides high school graduates from 2012 onwards with up to \$2,000 over four years to be applied toward tuition fees at any Saskatchewan post-secondary institution.
- The Seniors Income Plan (SIP) benefit increases up to \$50 per month start July 2012 with increases of up to \$10 per month in each of the next three years.
