PROVINCE REMAINS ON TRACK WITH BALANCED BUDGET

The First Quarter Financial Report released today by Deputy Premier and Finance Minister Ken Krawetz shows that Saskatchewan remains on track to have the only provincial balanced budget in Canada in 2012-13.

A weak global economic recovery has fuelled volatility in commodity markets, reducing renewable resource revenue. Overall, revenue is forecast to be down \$113.2 million from budget, largely due to reduced revenue projections from oil and Crown land sales.

"While resource revenue can fluctuate over the course of an entire year, the overall strength of our economy coupled with our government's commitment to sound fiscal management will ensure a balanced budget for the people of Saskatchewan," Krawetz said. 40th SASKATCHEWAN SUMMER GAMES



I had the privilege of participating in the opening ceremonies of the 40th Saskatchewan Summer Games in Meadow Lake July 29 along with my colleague Jeremy Harrison, MLA, Meadow Lake. This year approximately 2,000 athletes are participating in the games which wrapped up August 4. The athletes represent nine districts in Saskatchewan – Regina, South East, South West, Parkland Valley, Prairie Central, Saskatoon, Rivers West, Lakeland, and North.

My daughter, Paige, participated in the games this year and I am very proud to say that she has won six medals! Her gold medals came in the 11 and 12 age group events for the 100m backstroke and 200m individual medley, while she earned her silver medals in the 200 and 400m freestyle, 200m backstroke, and 50m butterfly. Speaking to the Saskatoon Star Phoenix, Paige said, "I've had lots of support from family, friends, and my teammates." She also acknowledged two coaches who played key roles. Geoff



Waugh has coached her all year with the Goldfins, and Nadine Brenaut helped her leading up to Meadow Lake. "(Waugh) has been very supportive. He's always pushed me to be my best. He's such a great coach," said Cheveldayoff. "Nadine Brenaut, I didn't know her for too long, but she's very nice. She pushes you, but she doesn't point out what you're doing wrong, she points out what you need to do better."

Congratulations to all the athletes who have participated and to the volunteers who have ensured the games ran smoothly.

PREMIER LOOKING TO MAKE HEALTH CARE BETTER ACROSS CANADA

Premier Brad Wall and P.E.I. Premier Robert Ghiz released a health report entitled, "From Innovation to Action" to Canadian premiers at the recent Council of the Federation meeting in Halifax.

The report provides practical and innovation solutions to improve the country's health care system in a sustainable way. Three of the areas the Premiers focused were the clinical practice guidelines, team-based health care delivery models, and health human resources management initiatives.

PUTTING PATIENTS FIRST

As part of the province's continued efforts to improve access to high-quality patient care, Health Minister Dustin Duncan announced \$9.83 million in funding for a new program to encourage and reward family physicians in providing patients with a full range of services.

"Physicians are vital partners as we transform our health system to better meet patients' needs, including improving access to health care," Duncan said. "As part of our agreement with the Saskatchewan Medical Association, I am pleased to introduce the Family Physician Comprehensive Care Program to recognize family physicians that provide patients with a full range of primary care services, while at the same time encouraging more physicians to expand their practices to full comprehensive care."

Physicians who qualify for the program monitor the overall health of their patients, collaborate with other health care providers on their care, and manage their patients' chronic diseases. In addition, qualifying physicians are caring for their patients when they are hospitalized, in a nursing home, or having a baby.

"We know from other high-performing health systems that when patients are provided comprehensive primary care services, such as chronic disease management, their health and satisfaction with the service improves - and this approach is consistent with our focus on patient- and family-centered health care," Duncan said.

PUBLIC INPUT NEEDED ON FUTURE OF ELECTRONIC HEALTH RECORDS

Eventually, every person in the province will have an electronic health record (EHR) that is a private, lifetime record of their medical history. These EHRs will provide authorized health care professionals immediate access to test results, past treatments, and medication profiles. At this point, some of the infrastructure is already in place, or under development, which will feed into the information for the EHR.

"We have made a great effort to ensure we are putting the patient first in our health care system, and that includes their electronic health information." Health Minister Dustin Duncan said. "It's important that we know what the patient or caregiver needs and wants in that technology and that will be the most value to them."

Information collected through the surveys, combined with feedback being gathered through health sector workshops taking place over the summer, will help shape the future of electronic health records in Saskatchewan.

Because of Robin's commitment to the community, city, and province, he has been honoured with the Canada 125 Medal, Saskatchewan Centennial Medal, Saskatoon 100 Reasons Award, as well as the Saskatchewan Volunteer Medal.

Robin has recently been nominated for one of the ScotiaBank's Game Changers. If he is chosen as The Saskatchewan Roughrider ScotiaBank Game Changer, the proceeds will go to Saskatchewan's Children's Hospital Foundation.

- The Active Families Benefit Program includes all children and youth under 18 years old in order to increase access to sport, culture and recreation opportunities.
- Budget 2012-13 contains \$1.74 billion in total school operating funding, a five per cent increase.
- The commitment to spend \$2.2 billion over four years on highways and transportation infrastructure is fulfilled with \$581.5 million in spending.
- To encourage construction of new multi-unit rental housing projects, there is a corporate income tax rebate equal to 10 per cent of the rental income generated from newly constructed multi-unit rental projects, for a period of up to ten years. When combined with other housing initiatives, it's expected to encourage the construction of an additional 10,000 new rental units in the province over the life of the program.
