

# Provincial Point of View September 20, 2013

#### STEADY PROGRESS IN REDUCING WAITS FOR SURGERY PATIENTS

Saskatchewan patients continue to receive surgeries sooner, thanks to improvements in how surgical care is planned and delivered.

The latest monthly data update indicates as of July 31, there were 6,105 patients waiting more than three months for surgery. This is a decrease of 61 per cent (or 9,237 fewer patients) compared to the start of the Initiative in April 2010 when more than 15,000 patients were waiting more than three months.

Increased provincial funding for the Saskatchewan Surgical Initiative has resulted in a seven per cent boost in the number of surgeries performed so far in the 2013-14 year. Patients have received 28,492 surgeries in the first four months of the fiscal year, up from 26,567 performed April 1 to July 31 in 2012.

Nine out of 10 health regions are providing surgeries to more than 90 per cent of their patients within six months.

There were 18,525 patients waiting for surgery in the province on July 31, 2013, down from 26,743 in November 2007 and from 27,585 when the Surgical Initiative was launched in April 2010.

The province committed \$70.5 million to improve access to surgery in the 2013-14 fiscal year. About 89,000 surgeries will be performed in Saskatchewan this year, an increase of 7,000 from last year.



## RECYCLING OF ANTIFREEZE AND OTHER PETROLEUM PRODUCTS SOON AVAILABLE IN SASKATCHEWAN

I was pleased to announce the new regulations in recycling antifreeze and other petroleum products in Saskatchewan.

You can now recycle antifreeze and its containers, diesel exhaust fluid containers and diesel fuel filters. This is to help increase the amount of petroleum products that can be recycled in our province and provides greater environmental benefits.

A survey commissioned by SARRC - Saskatchewan Association for Resource Recovery said the public support for the addition of these products was strong. The more types of products like these that can be recycled is valuable to all of us, and anything that can help take the strain off of the environment and lower the Carbon Footprint in Saskatchewan rewards everyone.

Manufacturers, distributors, wholesalers, and retailers can now collect and recycle the new

petroleum products through the SARRC. The changes will come into effect January 1, 2014.

#### SASKATCHEWAN EI BENEFICIARIES DROP IN JULY


The number of beneficiaries collecting Employment Insurance (EI) in Saskatchewan dropped in July by 3.6 per cent over the previous month, according to a report issued by Statistics Canada today.

This was the third largest decline in the country, tied with Newfoundland and Labrador.

Year-over-year, there were 10,160 beneficiaries receiving regular El benefits in the province in July 2013, a decrease of 7.1 per cent from July 2012.

Although Regina saw a small increase in regular El beneficiaries of 0.8 per cent, Saskatoon saw a drop of 8.5 per cent annually.

#### SASKATCHEWAN SNOWBOARDER A FAVOURITE FOR WINTER GAMES IN RUSSIA
